MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Conversation with [redacted], 21 June 1949

1. I straightened out with [redacted] the confusion that resulted from [redacted] request to the British for sabotage manuals. He showed himself agreeable to locating such manuals.

2. We discussed the possible exchange of current intelligence on Albania. He said that he would investigate and get in touch with me when he had informed himself as to what was available. He agreed that we should cooperate on this matter. [redacted] inquired as to how information would be exchanged. I suggested that we would do it by hand in each other's presence without reference to the CIA Liaison in London. He inquired further as to whether we were going to inform [redacted]. I told him that I did not know, but rather supposed we would not at this stage of the game.

3. He suggested informally that OPC might be interested in sending one person to the UK to take the British SO course.
