A. Mission

See Sections II and III, Part II of the "Country Plan for Albania" for a discussion of the cold war mission and tasks.

B. Accomplishments

(1) Paramilitary

a. Several attempts to infiltrate a four-man team into the area of Korce in Southeastern Albania were unsuccessful due to heavy snows in the area. The mission of this team was to determine the reaction to the first BGFIEND propaganda supply drop at Korce on 19 December 1951. It was decided to postpone the infiltration of this team until early spring and the advent of favorable weather conditions.

b. Exfiltration - A secret ink letter has recently been received from the four-man team that has been operating in the area of Kukes in northern Albania during the summer and fall of 1951. The letter advises that all four members of the team are wintering in Prishtine, Yugoslavia and intend to reenter Albania in the spring. They requested, and are being sent, food parcels and money to sustain them during the remainder of their stay in Yugoslavia. Because of weather conditions it will be impossible to send a contact mission to this team until spring.

c. One three-man team dropped in West Central Albania last October has not yet been heard from.

d. No supply drops were attempted during the month of January.

(2) Political

a. Psychological warfare - The Voice of Free Albania, the BOFIEND clandestine radio station near Athens, is continuing to pursue its daily broadcasting schedule.

b. Publications - The first edition of the NCPA semi-monthly newspaper Shqipëria printed in Rome was published on the first of January.

c. The third issue of the NCPA newsletter, published on the fifth of January, contained a plea to Greece, Yugoslavia, and Italy to pledge their agreement in principle to an independent Albania. This item received considerable attention in the Western press. The newsletter is published irregularly in English, French and Italian.

d. The second propaganda supply drop was effected on the night of 21 January over northern Albania. The towns of Scutari, Kukes, Buttel, and Tirana were among the targets. Supplies included nine hundred cans of scarce consumer goods and 250 bags containing one pound of flour each.

e. A leaflet drop mission scheduled for this month was combined with the Propaganda Supply drop discussed in sub-paragraph h above due to poor weather conditions over the target country during this month. 208,000 double cartoon leaflets and 5,000 copies of Shqiperia were distributed. An additional joint Propaganda Supply and Leaflet drop is planned for the southern part of Albania as soon as weather permits.

f. Political Developments - Ishan Teptani, a member of the General Committee of the NQFA attended a meeting of the European movement which convened on the 20th of January in London.

g. Intelligence - The League of Albanian Political Exiles in Yugoslavia formed at Prizren on 10 May 1951 is reported to have begun dissemination of a new Publication, "Flag of Freedom" which has the apparent policy of supporting the Albanian people in their struggle against the tyranny of the Hoxha government.

(4) Support

a. Training - The assignment of Ibrahim Kelmendi and Adem Selimi to the ZRELOPE school in the United States was cancelled at the last minute. The cancellation resulted from the inability of the members of the NQFA to agree on the final selection of these two individuals.

b. Recruiting

1. An Albanian border guide has been recruited as a support agent for future overland infiltrations.

2. The British SS has offered to provide BGFIED with three w/T students whose training is said to be three-quarters completed. Action is under way to test the physical and mental capabilities of the three British trainees. If it is determined they are properly qualified, the

British offer will be accepted and training will be completed at the covert W/T training schools in Germany.

3. The ZRELOPE recruitment staff has been advised of BQFIEND's 1952 requirements and is providing necessary support to the project.

c. Disposal - Twenty Albanian graduates of the covert training school that were being held in Athens were returned to the Guard Company on 16 January. This disposal action was taken in an effort to increase the security of future FIEND infiltration operations.

d. Administration [redacted] present BQFIEND Deputy Project Chief [redacted] is now in Washington for reassignment to BGCONVOY as Project Chief [redacted]

The operations of BQFIEND progressed routinely during the month. While progress was registered in the political and psychological warfare fields, agents operations were slowed by winter conditions.
