10. FACTS, EVALUATION AND COMMENT: (Use additional plain sheet if necessary)

A. Mission

See Sections II and III, Part II of the "Country Plan for Albania" for a discussion of the cold war mission and tasks.

B. Accomplishments

(1) Infiltration

4. There was no infiltration of ICFIND teams into Albania during the month of February. However, a letter has recently been received from the leader of one of the three agent teams dropped into Albania in November, 1950 which provides us with new information on this team, which we have previously considered as having defected to the Yugoslavs. The letter stated that immediately after landing in Albania the team was forced to enter Yugoslavia where they rallied 16 comrades and re-entered Albania after a battle with the Yugoslav Security Police. After an encounter with the "Albanian Army" the group divided into four parties all of which were ultimately attacked by the security forces. Of the twenty men who began this mission, only six survived. The letter states that the survivors are in Yugoslavia awaiting instructions from the HFA.

Although there is every reason to believe that the survivors of this ICFIND team are under Yugoslav control, there may be some truth in the team leader's report that adherents were readily found in the Khasova. The report also provides additional confirmation of the strength and efficiency of the Albanian Security Police.

b. Food parcels and money were sent during February to the four man team which is wintering in Prison, Yugoslavia.

c. Plans are proceeding to affect the movement for Zog's supporters from Egypt via Paris and Munich to Greece where they will be infiltrated into Albania.

d. One three man team dropped in West Central Albania last October has not yet been heard from.

e. No supply drops were attempted during the month of February.

(2) Political

a. Psychological Warfare - The Voice of Free Albania, the BGFIEDND clandestine radio station near Athens, has increased its broadcast schedule to three times daily. It is hoped that this enlarged schedule will increase the chances of the station being heard within Albania despite the adverse atmospheric conditions which pervade that area during the winter months. The BGFIEDND psychological warfare officer has reported that he travelled to Northern Greece with a portable radio in an effort to determine the quality of the VFA signal. He reported that the quality of the signal in that area coupled with the bad atmospheric conditions confirmed the fact that reception in the target area is uncertain. Although there have been reports of jamming, the P/W officer reported that he did not hear jamming while in Northern Greece.

b. Publications -

(1) The NCPA semi-monthly newspaper Shqipëria, printed in Rome, was published on schedule.

(2) 50,000 copies of the eighth issue of the miniature edition of Shqipëria was printed in New York per normal routine and sent to Athens 597937 to be used in air drops over Albania.

c. The fourth issue of the NCPA newsletter, was published on the fourth of February in Rome and mailed to more than 3000 persons throughout the world. The newsletter will continue to be published irregularly in English, French and Italian.

d. The third propaganda supply drop was effected on the night of 26 February over the coastal area of Southern Albania. The target was an area just South of the town of Valona. The BOFIND covert plane dropped a cargo of 2,058 pounds which included free-fall 1 pound bags of flour and parachute-borne cans of scarce consumer goods such as macaroni, rice, raisins and salt. Exact details of this drop have not yet been received from the field.

f. Political Developments - The OPC and British service representatives to the NCPA have submitted a tentative agenda for a proposed meeting of the general committee called to broaden the NCPA. This agenda was prepared for consideration at the forthcoming FIEND/VALUABLE London meeting which will discuss the future role of the NCPA and settle the outstanding problems existing between FIEND/VALUABLE that have developed since the October Rome meeting.

g. Intelligence - Unsubstantiated reports have been received of a revolution which allegedly took place in Albania on 29 February. It was supposedly led by the secretary of the Central Committee of the Albanian Workers Party. Unfortunately, details of these reports have not been received.

Another important intelligence development brought to our attention during the month is a report from Istanbul that King Zog is sending an emissary to Tito to attempt to effect an alliance whereby Tito would maintain a hands off policy in the event the Zogist forces were successful in fomenting a coup in Albania or a revolution against the Hoxha regime.

a. Training - Three Albanian W/T operators secured from the British service were moved to the Guard Company in Germany for assessment and further training. Also, 97 Albanians were screened for W/T ability and 23 candidates were selected as a preliminary pool for W/T training.

Two doctors were moved from Rome to the Guard Company on 16 February.

b. Administration - [] BOFIELD Psychological Warfare Officer was in Washington from the 19th to the 29th of February for headquarters conferences. He is returning to Athens after a brief stop-over in Rome for a conference with [] BOFIELD liaison officer with the NCFB.

1. Favorable conditions of which advantage was taken:

4. Lessons Learned:

The letter from the team leader mentioned in section B, para 1a provided us with an extremely detailed account of the team's activities since its infiltration in late 1950. It gives us a clearer understanding of team problems in the field, the increased effectiveness of the security forces, the rashness of the team leader who disobeyed instructions and proceeded to procure arms in Yugoslavia, engage the security police in gunfights, and write letters about his activities. As a consequence, it is clearly apparent that more extensive briefing of agents is needed as well as a higher degree of selectivity for team leaders. It is noteworthy

that the team found support in the area, both in terms of active volunteers and help from the local citizenry. Also, that the team continues to send letters to the NCFA evidencing a willingness to continue operations.

5. Course or courses of action to be taken:

It is presently planned to continue to develop the project in accordance with the revised project outline, appropriate policy directives, and recent field operational meetings.
