Action Requested: None; for information and files.

1. There are eight **COMMINT** agent standbys.

2. **ALPWISE** telephoned this office on 14 November from Patras and reported he was running out of funds. He requested an advance on his salary. **C** instructed **AFSMOG** to cable the money requested. On 25 November **ALPWISE** telephoned again as ordered and was instructed to report to Athens on 28 November.

3. On 24 November, **ALPWISE** arrived in Athens and **C** met him at the LEE. He was payed and **C** observed that he did not appear well. When asked about his health, **ALPWISE** said he had not been feeling well and for that reason had not gone to Lavrion for the Flag Day celebration. He was told to see a doctor if he did not feel better by the next day.

4. **RFORDAIE** and **AFREACK** arrived in Athens from Patras on 1 November. **C**, with **AFSMOG**, picked them up in an operational vehicle and the meeting was held while driving around the outskirts of Athens. The men were payed and also submitted a formal request in writing to be returned from Kalamai to Athens. **C** turned down their request and instructed them to return to Kalamai by 2 November.

5. **RFORDAIE** telephoned this office on 25 November and requested permission to attend the 28 November celebration at Lavrion. He was informed that a request had already been made to the Greek authorities to notify the local police in Kalamai and the men were not to leave until they had received official permission. As a result of the apparent jurisdictional rivalry now existing between **AFREACK** and **RFORDAIE**, the confusion caused by the recent reshuffling of commands and just plain insufficient management, **AFREACK** and **RFORDAIE** were not granted permission to leave Kalamai until 2 December. In spite of insistent requests on the part of our Liaison Section and visits to every available office concerned, nothing could be done.

6. AIRWAY left Greece on 17 November and is now living in the United States. [] had a long meeting with him on 12 November for debriefing and to discuss his termination. AIRWAY reported to the DIG again on 15 November. He was payed the regular separation pay and in addition [] presented him with a new suit and a pair of shoes as a going away gift. AIRWAY's termination papers were forwarded in SGAA 18601, 6 December 1955.

7. AICCOL reported to I.C.E.H. on 10 November to register prior to commencing school at the Benchfitters Course in Pireaus. He checked out of his hotel in Rafina on 18 November and remained at the DIG over the weekend prior to starting school on 21 November.

8. AIRBLOWN arrived at the DIG on 22 November where [] advised him AICCOL was to share his quarters in Pireaus while attending school. [] requested AIRBLOWN to take a close interest in AICCOL and see that he observed proper security in all his activities. [] has had several meetings with AIRBLOWN for the purpose of discussing AIRBLOWN's observations of AICCOL. On 29 November AIRBLOWN met both men and passed them their pay.

9. AIPUMP arrived in Athens on 15 November and [] met him at the DIG. He was instructed to report to I.C.E.H. for registration and was briefed on the necessary details of his cover story. AIPUMP returned to Khalkis on 18 November with instructions to report to Athens again on 22 November to obtain the necessary police clearances for resettlement processing.

10. AILIGH also arrived in Athens on 26 November from Khalkis in order to attend the celebration at Lavrion. On 29 November both AILIGH and AIPUMP reported to the DIG where they were paid and instructed to return to Khalkis that same day.

11. AILETT, the nephew of REPUTLOG, also left Greece for the United States on 17 November. Through RNADUAMA, [] arranged to meet AILETT at the REBERGH apartment on 16 November. [] paid AILETT the \$600.00 in pay accumulated by REPUTLOG from the time he parachuted into Albania until his execution in Tirana. In previous discussions with AILETT, it had been agreed that we would hold this money for him until he was ready to depart Greece. AILETT was extremely grateful. The name and address of his sponsor is being forwarded to Headquarters under separate cover. Authorization for this payment was received in DIR 39064, 19 February 1955.
