- I. PROJECT: BGFIND-BGCONVOY (at MOS Germany only)
- II. AUTHORIZED DURATION: Indefinite
- III. ORGANIZATIONAL DATA:

1. On 17 June, 1953, [] will EI, following a 30 month tour with the Balkan Desk German Mission. Contingent to Headquarters comment to the German Mission approval for his inclusion on the 1954 German Mission T/O, [] will travel either on PCS or Leave status.

2. In Mid-February, [] was promoted to the rank of Sergeant First Class. This promotion is important in that it enables [] to recover his desired MOS (1017-Master Baker) although he is not at present performing in this capacity.

IV. SUMMARY OF ACTIVITY:

BGFIND

1. In late March, JEPARSON was visited by Said Kryeziu, Abas Ermenje and G. Gogo, members of HHEIGH. They were escorted to Munich by []. Together, [], who had arrived from Frankfurt, and [], met with the three representatives and the temporary C.O. at JEPARSON at which time the representatives expressed their appreciation of the present manner with which JEPARSON administrative policies are conducted, paying special tribute to the temporary C.O. Several minor administrative issues were amicably resolved with the temporary C.O. clarifying his functions as set by higher authority. Later, at an assemblage of the entire KEMAHOO complement, the representatives delivered speeches keynoting several points outlined by []. Emphasis was placed on the part JEPARSON will play in the over-all picture of operations and the cooperation desired between the military with respect to its interests vis-a-vis JEPARSON and the JEPARSONITES themselves. Results indicate that these visits create continued interest among the JEPARSONITES with regard to present duties as well as a sober expectation of future assignments.

2. All but two JEPARSONITES have been issued the Fremden Pass. This documentation should be completed within several days.

3. No letters from Isuf Maja were received during this reporting period. Maja states that he expects to receive several letters from his nephew within a short time. Maja thinks that his nephew is presently in northern KEMAHOO LAND. [] continues to pay Maja the Deutsche Mark equivalent of \$20.00 per month.

4. Construction by the Military of a three story Mess-Billet at JEPARSON will be completed by early June, 1953. The entire JEPARSON KEMAHOO complement will be housed in this structure, thus enabling the Temporary C.O. to reshuffle present billet arrangements whereby the several political factions are grouped according to party interests. This change in billet assignments should help to further eliminate partisan sentiment and offer added opportunity for us to encourage unified action and endeavor.

5. In mid-April, Vath Capelli, who had arrived from Rome, was met and

placed in JEPARSON by [] Capelli will be included on the official Roster by early May.

6. For disciplinary cause, Seit Aliaj was discharged from JEPARSON in late April.

7. Present strength JEPARSON is 198. Capelli's inclusion will raise the strength to 199, leaving two vacancies.

EGGONVOX

1. In order to uncover certain features of Tosho Damianou's activities between 1946-1948, [] travelled to Lins, Austria, to confer with an ODOPAL Special Agent who controlled Damianou during the period in question. As a result of this visit, [] gathered several important facts that formed the basis of Damianou's second CARRIAGE conducted in late March (Results of CARRIAGE sent to Hqs. and []). In late April, [] visited Munich to arrange for a third and final CARRIAGE of Damianou, outlining a questionnaire directed to clear up any questions surrounding dealings that Damianou might have had with the French. [] will arrange this final CARRIAGE, to be held in mid-May.

2. [] continues to transmit SGRIND evaluations as well as reports concerning Bulgarian Emigres to Headquarters and []. In addition he forwards various Bulgarian publications.

3. Boyan Panov has been dropped as a possible candidate.
