(4) The fact that there are many problems in dealing with Japan does not alter the necessity of setting up a satisfactory policy and implementing it astutely. There are some hopeful signs, among which the most significant are Japanese efforts at establishing cooperative liaison with Chinese liberals.				
a. TOGATA (sic - probably OGATA), active Minister without Portfolio, who is en route to SEA has sent a representative to make contact with HSU Ch'ung-chih and Dr. C.T. WANG. Dr. WANG is extremely active as a proponent of the belief that any satisfactory solution in the Far East must be based upon Chinese-Japanese cooperation.
