1. PER PARA 4 REF, () ATTENDED SMALL DINNER PARTY GIVEN BY OGATA 19 NOVEMBER 52.

2. COURSE OF CONVERSATION WAS GENERAL WITH NO SPECIFIC COMMITMENTS EITHER SIDE. THERE WAS MUTUAL EXCHANGE GOOD WILL AND COMMON INDICATION COOPERATIVE ATTITUDE. OGATA EXPRESSED APPRECIATION FOR BRIEFING HE HAD RECEIVED (SEE REF) AND STATED HE WOULD USE SAME AS REFERENCE IN ORGANIZING NEW INTELLIGENCE SERVICE. HE INDICATED HE HAD OPEN FIELD IN SETTING UP NEW SERVICE AND INTENDED TO APPOINT BEST POSSIBLE PEOPLE INTO IT.

3. 1 POINT POSSIBLE SIGNIFICANCE WAS OGATA GENERAL ATTITUDE CONFIDENCE IN CHINATS GOVT AND STATEMENT CHINATS CURRENTLY GAINING STRENGTH AND SUPPORT FROM OVERSEAS CHINESE THROUGHOUT SOUTH EAST ASIA. HE OPINED EISENHOWER ELECTION INDICATED TO MOST CHINESE THAT CHIANG KAI-SHEK WOULD RECEIVE INCREASED U.S. SUPPORT AND THAT THIS WOULD HELP CHINATS AMONG ALL OVERSEAS CHINESE. HE STATED THAT LITTLE POTENTIAL STRENGTH WAS TO BE FOUND AMONG THIED FORCE.
