<p style="text-align: center;">THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS EXCERPTED VERBATIM</p> <p>Summary of the Japanese Press Today's Tokyo Newspapers</p> <p>NATIONAL DEFENSE</p> <p>Liberal Chief Secretary SATO asserted yesterday that it is unconstitutional to build up "self-defense war potential". Countering the stand taken by the Progressive Reform Party Wednesday, he emphasized that Japan must revise Article 9 of the Constitution by popular mandate before it can establish a defense army. SATO's statement revealed that while some Liberals want to quicken the defense effort, the party's basic policy for a gradual defense buildup remains unchanged. The Liberal Party defense policy will take clearer shape after the conference today between Prime Minister YOSHIDA and Deputy Prime Minister <u>OGATA</u>.
