Japan Press Summary Today's Tokyo Newspapers POLITICS Decision to arrest two top Liberal chiefs--Political Research Committee Chairman IKEDA and Chief Secretary SATO--still hangs fire. Prosecution authorities meeting yesterday put off a decision until today's session. SATO told the press last night after a talk with Prime Minister YOSHIDA and Deputy Prime Minister OGATA that he was "still in one piece." He said he was talking with parties concerned to protect his position. "I've no idea to resign from my job... both YOSHIDA and OGATA realize my position and sympathize with me," he said. Earlier in the day, OGATA, who was in an "unusual ill humor," dodged a press interview calling "journalistic fuss" an embarrassment. But it is believed that the government wants to delay the arrest of the two Liberal bigshots as long as possible to work up countermeasures. And judging from OGATA's bad humor following his talk with YOSHIDA, some believe that YOSHIDA remained "bullish."
