List of active members of the Freies Deutschland Komitee.

- ABEL, Dr. Heinrich. Lieutenant, Teacher, Hitler Youth leader, active in the Catholic Youth Movement before 1933. Frequently spoke over the "Free Germany" radio station.
- ACHILLES, fnu. Corporal, 43rd Infantry Regiment. Before war student in Altenburg.
- \* ACKERMAN, Anton. Prominent communist politician before 1933. Fled to Moscow then. One of the original members of the movement.
- ALMENDINGER, Karl. General, commanded the XVIIth Army. Knights' Cross bearer. Captured May 1944 around Sevastopol. Born 1891 in Altgmuend.
- \* ARENDSEE, Martha. Communist member of the Reichstag before Hitler. In Moscow since 1933. Frequent speaker over the "Free Germany" radio station.
- ARNDT, fnu. Captain. Protestant Chaplain with the 24th Panzer Division.
- ARNIM, Fritz Sixt von. Lieutenant General, CO 113th Infantry Division. Captured at Stalingrad. Cousin of the General von ARNIM captured by the Americans in Tunisia.
- BAMLER, Rudolf. Lieutenant General, CO 12th Infantry Division. Born 1896.
- BAUMGARTEN, Dr. Otto. Major, Medical Corps, 113th Infantry Regiment. Before the war active in Catholic affairs in Munich. Taught at Munich University.
- BAYER, fnu. Lieutenant General, CO 153rd Infantry Division.
- X - BECHER, Johannes. Communist Party functionary. In Russia since 1933. Noted writer. Credited with converting Field Marshal PAULUS. Now executive committee SED.
- \* BECHLER, Bernard. Major with 29th Panzer Grenadier Division. Very active. Now Minister of the Interior, Brandenburg.
- BECHLY, Gerhard. Lieutenant Colonel and Adjutant 29th Infantry Division. From Magdeburg.
- BOEBM, fnu. Lieutenant. Now Chief of Student Affairs, Central Administration for Education, Russian Zone.
- BUSCHENHAGEN, Erich. General. CO 15th Infantry Division.
- BISSING, von. Colonel, CO 208th Infantry Regiment. University Professor.
- BOEHME, fnu. Lieutenant General. CO Vth Army Corps.
- BOGEN, von. Major General, CO 302nd Infantry Division.
- BRANDT, Arthur, Major General. Town Commandant of Ploesti, Rumania. Born Stolberg.
- \* BRIDEL, Willy. Communist Party functionary. Fled to Russia in 1933.
- BREDT, fnu. Lieutenant Colonel. Quartermaster, Xth Army Corps. From Goslar. Active in Stahlhelm before 1933.
- BUECHLER, Fritz. Major, 241st Anti-Aircraft Regiment. Editor of the "Free Germany" newspaper.

- BURCK, Lieut. Front-propagandist.
- BURCKHARDT, fnu. Lieut. General, Vith Army. Captured at Stalingrad.
- CANSTEIN, Dr. Herbert Rabe von. Major. Hospital director from Siegen.
- CLEMENT, Gerhard. SS-Hauptscharfuhrer, 6th SS-Infantry Regiment. Salesman in Dresden before the war. Speaker on the "Free Germany" radio station.
- CONRADY, Alexander. Major General. CO 383rd Infantry Division. Knights' Cross bearer. Born 1903, Neu-Ulm.
- CZIMATIS, Albrecht. Colonel. Deputy CO 306th Infantry Division. Famous engineer. Member of the OKW and OKH. Credited with being one of the originators of the Goering 4-year plan.
- \* DANIELS, Alexander Edler von. CO 376th Inf. Division. Knights' Cross Bearer. Was the first general surrendering at Stalingrad. One of the original organizers of the BDO and Free Germany Committee.
- DEBOI, Heinrich. Lieut. General. CO 44th Inf. Division. Knights' Cross bearer. Born 1892.
- DENGLER, Dr. Gerhard. Captain, 3rd Artillery Regiment. Comes from Eberswalde.
- DEWITZ, von Hans von Krebs. Major General. Former commandant of Kishinev.
- DOERNBERG, fnu. Lieutenant, 3rd Inf. Division. Now Ministerial Dirigent, Provincial Government, Mecklenburg.
- \* DOMASCH, Erich. Captain. 2nd Bn, 103rd Panzer Grenadier Division. Before the war student, University of Koenigsberg. One of the founders of the "Free Germany" movement.
- DRABICH, Waechter von. Colonel. Chief of staff XLIInd Army Corps.
- DREBBER, Moritz von. Major General. Born 1892.
- \* EINSIEDEL, Heinrich Graf von. Lieutenant and Adjutant of the Udet-Squadron. Founder of the BDO and the Free Germany Committee. Great-grandchild of BISMARCK.
- EMMENDORFER, Max. KPD functionary in Frankfurt am Main before Hitler. Corporal. Vice President of the "Free Germany" Committee. Very active. Editor of the organization's newspaper.
- ENGL, fnu. Major General. CO 45th Inf. Division.
- ENGELBRECHT, Erwin. Major, Chief of Staff, 14th Panzer Division.
- ERMANNSDORF, Gottfried von. Major General. Former commandant of Mohilev. Born 1893, Kamenz, Saxony. Knights' Cross bearer.
- ESCHHORN, Jakob. Corporal. Theological student, at one time Franciscan monk. Very active. Editor of the "Free Germany" newspaper and frequent speaker on the radio.
- FATERMANN, Walter. Sergeant, 512th Inf. Regiment. Born 1913, Berlin. Member of SS and NSDAP since 1934, joined Gestapo in 1937. Acted as agent behind the German lines. Member of Free Germany steering committee.
- FISCHER, Ernst. Communist functionary before Hitler.
- FLEISCHER, Bodo. Captain. Economist from Braunschweig.
- FLESCHUT, Reinhold. Private, 276th Inf. Regiment. Very active. Born in Plauen.
- FLORIN, Wilhelm. Communist Reichstag representative, from Essen. Born 1894, Cologne. Uses the alias of FLORIAN and NIEBERGALL. Also active in CALPO affairs in France.

FRANEK, Dr. Fritz. Lieutenant General, CO 73rd Inf Division. Born 1891, Austrian.

FRANKEN, Lilli. Communist emigre, in Moscow since 1933. Regular member of the German propaganda section of the Moscow Radio.

\* FRANKENBERG und PROSCHLITZ, Egbert von. Major. Adjutant 5th Air Squadron Colonel of the SA. Active in student affairs at University of Berlin before war. Cofounder of the Free Germany movement.

FROST, Inu. Captain. Now Oberbuergermeister, Stralsund.

FROENKING, Inu. Major General. CO 282nd Inf Division,

FUEHNBERG, Friedl. Austrian socialist. Commentator on the Austrian program of Radio Moscow. *Communist!*

GAERTNER, Irene. Political refugee from Germany. Before Hitler active in leftist women's movements.

GEBE, Werner. Major General, CO 9th Infantry Division. Member of the People's Court (Volksgerichtshof)

GERLACH, Dr. Heinrich, Lt., 14th Panzer Division. Public School teacher in Elbing. Speaker on the Moscow FD radio station.

GIHR, Major General. CO 383rd Inf Division.

GOLLWITZER, Friedrich. General, LIIIrd Army Corps.

GRUBERHAGEN, Dr. Adolf, Lieutenant, 297th Inf. Division. Archeologist at the University of Koenigsberg before the war.

HAMANN, Adolf. Major General, former commandant of Orel. (Was accused of war crimes and may have been executed.)

HADERMANN, Dr. Ernst. Captain 152nd Artillery Regiment. Before the war high-school teacher in Kassel. Now Superintendent of Schools, Central Administration for Education, Russian Zone.

HAUFER, Arthur. Major General. Chief of German Mission to Rumania. Commanded XIIIth Army Corps. Seriously wounded and may be dead by now.

HEIGEL, Heins. Colonel. CO, 3rd Panzer Regiment, Hermann-Goering Division.

HEITZ, Walter. Colonel General. CO XVIIIth Army Corps. Born Berlin 1878. Former Commanding General, West Prussia.

HELL, Ernst Eberhard. General. CO VIIth Army Corps. Knights' Cross bearer. Born 1897 in Stade.

HELMREICH, Albert. Sergeant. Formerly protestant pastor in Eckersmuehl. Editor of the Free Germany newspaper.

HERRNSTADT, Rudolf. Journalist. Political refugee.

HETZ, Karl. Major. Engineer from Koenigsberg. Member of Ost-Europa Institut. Very active as journalist and radio speaker for the FD Movement.

HEYNE, Hans Walter. Lieut. General. CO 6th Inf Division. Born 1884. Hannover.

HITZER, Alfons. Lieut. General, CO 206th Inf. Division. Born 1892. Hochstadt. Graduate of Strasbourg University.

- HOFFMEISTER, Edmund von. Lieutenant General. Formerly deputy military attache in Moscow. Ritterkreuz wearer. Former commander of XI1st Army Corps.
- HOEMANN, Karl. Political refugee. Speaker in the German section of Radio Moscow. Correspondent for "Pravda".
- HOMANN, Heinrich. Formerly a major in the 83rd Artillery Regiment. Studied at the University of Jena and Goettingen. Professional officer from Hamburg. Very active member of the "Free Germany" and the "Bund Deutscher Offisiere" movements.

- MATTARN, Hermann. political refugee. Former member of the Landtag. Now in the Landesvorstand of the SED.
- MICHAELIS, Herbert. Major General. Former commander of the 97th Infantry Division. Holder of the Ritterkreuz.
- MICHL, Walther. SS-Hauptsturmführer, Doctor. Former member of the Viking Reconnaissance Battalion. Austrian.
- MOHR, Peter. Former chaplain in the 16th Panzer Division. Catholic. From Botthard.
- MOSER, Hilmar. Lieutenant General and former commandant in Lublin. Professional officer since 1902. Born 1880

- \* PISCK, Wilhelm. Communist Party member. With German section of Politburo Born 1876 in Guben. Now head of the SED.
- PICKEL, Wilhelm. Colonel. Former commander of the 524th Grenadier Regiment. Very active member of the "Free Germany" movement.
- PLIVIER, Theodor. Communist Party member. Noted writer. Now very active SED.
- POSTEL, Georg. General of Artillery and former commander of the XXXth Army Corps.
- PRENKING. Major General. Former commander of the 282nd Infantry Division.

- RANTZAU, von. Formerly Consul of Embassy in Bucharest. Career diplomat. Signer of original "Free Germany" declaration.
- REICHERT. Former Captain. Now Landrat Schwerin-Mecklenburg.
- REYHER, Friedrich. First Lieutenant in 1st Engineer Battalion. From Dresden. Professional soldier.
- RODENEURG, Karl von. Lieutenant General and former commander of the 76th Infantry Division. Professional soldier. Wearer of the Oak Leaf decoration. Born 1894 in Geestemünde.
- RITTBERG, Graf Georg von. Lieutenant General and former commander of the 88th Panzergrenadier Division. Born 30 May 1898 in Strasburg.
- ROSEN, Oskar. Colonel, formerly Corps Artillery Commander XLIIth Army Corps.
- RÖCKEL, Ludwig. First lieutenant.
- ROSKE, Fritz. Major General. Graduate engineer. Captured at Stalingrad.
- RUCKER, Fritz. First Lieutenant in the 343rd Infantry Division. Formerly grammar school teacher in Berlin. Long a member of the SPD, was one of the founders of the Free Germany movement.
- SANNE, Werner. Lieutenant General. Former commander of the 100th Infantry Division. Ritterkreuz wearer. Son of gentleman farmer. Born 1889 in Berlin. Taken prisoner at Stalingrad.
- SLAUEN. Lieutenant Colonel. Former commander of the 391st Infantry Regiment.
- SCHLÖMME, Helmut. Lieutenant General. Professional soldier. Born 30 May 1893 in Hansberg.
- SCHMIDT. Major General. Former Commander of Engineers, 9th Army.
- SCHMIDT, Arthur. Lieutenant General. Former Chief of Staff of 6th Army. Born 1895. Captured at Stalingrad.
- SCHRÖDER, Johannes. Formerly protestant chaplain with 37th Infantry Division from Neumünster.
- SCHUSTER, Professor Franz. Historian. Fulltime worker in the "Free Germany" movement.
- SCHWAB, Sepp. Political refugee. Journalist. Apparently editor of the "Freies Deutschland" newspaper.
- SCHWARTZ. Lieutenant General. Former commander of the 376th Infantry Division.
- SEITZ fnu. Former major. Now mayor of Schwerin, Mecklenburg.
- \* SEYDLITZ-KURZBACH, Walther von. General. Former commander of the 51st Army Corps. Professional soldier. Born 1888 in Hamburg.
- SIMON, Walter. 1st Lieutenant. Now Ministerialdirektor, Schwerin.
- \* SOBOTKA, Gustav. KPD member. Former member of the Reichstag. Now leader of SdD and head of Central Administration, Fuel and Industry.
- SÖNNICHSEN, Nilolai. First Lieutenant. Protestant chaplain from Grazien.
- STEIDLE, Luitpold. Colonel. Former commander of the 767th Grenadier Regiment. Now chief of Central Administration for Food and Agriculture.
- STEINKELLER, Friedrich Karl von. Major General and former commander of the Feldhernhalle Division.

- STINGL. Major General and former commander of the 16th Infantry Division.
- STOSSLEIN, Herbert. Major. Formerly division engineer of the 44th Infantry. Very active member of the "Free Germany" movement, speaker on the Moscow FD Radio Station, and writer on the "Freies Deutschland" newspaper. Attended University of Munich, and comes from Hans.
- STRECKER. General of Infantry. Former commander of the XIth Army Corps. Captured at Stalingrad. Knights' Cross wearer. Entered army in 1905. Born 1884 in Radmannsdorf.
- TESCHNER, Georg. Major General and former commander of an Antiaircraft Brigade. In Air Ministry in 1940
- THIEL. Major General. Former commander of the 707th Infantry Division.
- TRAUT, Hans. Lieutenant General and former commander of the 78th Security Division.
- TRENKMAN, Hans Gottlieb. First Lieutenant, Air Corps. Member of steering committee (die Leitung) of the "Free Germany" movement. Speaker on the Moscow "FD" Radio Station and writer on the "Freies Deutschland" newspaper.
- TROGER, Hans. Lieutenant General. Former commander of the 13th Panzer Division.
- TRONNIER, Louis. Major General. Former commander of Task Force "F". Ritterkreuz wearer.
- TROWLITZ. Major General. Former commander of the 57th Infantry Division. Ritterkreuz wearer.
- ULRICH. Major General. Formerly Artillery Commander of 51st Army Corps. Captured at Stalingrad.
- \* ULBRICHT, Walther. KPD member. Former member of the Reichstag. Chief of Politburo (die politische Abteilung) of the KPD. Now in the executive committee of the SED.
- VÖLKERS, Paul. General. Former commander of the XXVIIth Army Corps. Professional soldier. Born 1891 in Kiel.
- WANDEL, Max. General. Ritterkreuz wearer. Born 1890.
- WANGENHEIM, Gustav, Baron von. Political refugee. Member of KPD in Moscow since 1933. Born 1895.
- WEINART, Erich. Member of KPD. Now head of "Kulturbund" in Russian Zone.
- WEINKNECHT, Friedrich. Lieutenant General and former commander of the 79th Infantry Division. Ritterkreuz wearer.
- WILLIMZIG, Dr. Walter. Lieutenant. Formerly Adjutant of the 261st Grenadier Regiment. Ritterkreuz wearer.
- \* WOLFF, Dr. Friedrich. Medical doctor. Member of KPD. Famous playwright (Prof Marnlock, Cyankali)
- VIAL. Colonel. Former commander of the 19th Panzer Grenadier Division. Ritterkreuz wearer.
- WESEMANN. General-Arbeits-Führer. Formerly in charge of compulsory labor.
- ZIEGLER, Bernhard. Possibly a political refugee.
