

1. It would appear (from para 2, ref B) that UPSWING and KUBARK already are in contact with one another on the medical aspects of this case. To introduce [] into this specific area of the CARETINA case could serve a useful purpose but would tend to jeopardize (if not completely break) the [] In short, efficiency might be gained, but security would probably suffer.

2. COS is in complete agreement with the [] suggestion that a good heart specialist is needed, and on the basis of the latter's recommendations, this case might be directed to a productive end. We suggest that [] could recommend a doctor whom we believe would meet with approval of both KUBARK and UPSWING. From ref B it appears to be a little late for KUBARK to even consider keeping CARETINA as an unilateral operation. And if Subject's physical condition is as described by [] the faster we take a positive approach in the case, the more we stand to gain. UPSWING probably feels the same way. The best we could hope for is a joint handling of Subject, with the decision to be made as to whether KUBARK or UPSWING takes control.

3. Unless we hear to the contrary we shall proceed in the implementation of the above.
