PARRILLI, Lt. Baron Luigi

1. WALDMANN letter of 11 July 49, in Circus ITALY file.  
S. G. requested that a non-Ger. fill the post of representative of the Order of Malta for Germany, and consequently Parrilli was appointed. PARRILLI first came to Munich in the fall of 1948. He knows about Rusty in general but not in detail. He knows BARKER and a number of American friends of the project. On this trip he was accompanied by a friend, whom he intended to make his personal secretary in Germany. This man, Guido J. ZIMMER, Erlangen, Bavaria, Mozartstrasse 26. According to a letter from THURM and ROHRSWEIN to WALDMANN, beginning of May 49, PARRILLI either resigned voluntarily or was forced out; the ostensible reason was his health.
2. JRX-1000, 6.2.48.  
PARRILLI was used as an intermediary for armistice negotiations with Allen DULLES.
3. JRX-3748, 20.6.48. (The ZIMMER notebooks)  
He had been one of the prominent double agents of Abteilung VI. "Bound hand and foot to Abt VI and the plans which ZIMMER (see item 1, above) and his superiors dictate." ZIMMER seems preoccupied with commercial espionage in Milan. In connection with surrender negotiations ZIMMER built up PARRILLI for his first social contacts following P's qualms about having aided the Partisans under duress in Aug 44.
4. MGL-A-34, 22 Jun 49.  
Luigi PARRILLI, special envoy of Sovereign Order of Malta in Rome and present chief of Malta Mission in Munich, belongs to intimate circle of Max HUSMANN, who resides in Zurich. DOLLMAN also involved.
5. MGL-A192, 9 Aug 49.  
PARRILLI is merely a mercenary opportunist who is utilizing his official position for personal profit.
6. MGL-A-425, 21 Sep 49.  
Luigi PARRILLI wrote Graf ORIOLA, Order of Malta representative in Munich, that Dr. SCHEIDER should get in touch with PARRILLI at the latter's Paris address; 5 Rue de General Appert, after 1 Sep 49.
