1. The attached letter from Parrilli to Jones dated 27 July 1945, sets forth some rather serious charges against Mr. Nigrella. Particularly in the first complete paragraph on the second page he mentions (rather informally, it is true) certain items which he claims were taken away from his home, for which Mr. Nigrella was responsible.

2. If we don't answer this letter, or at least obtain documentation against the charges, Parrilli will probably attempt to press the charges through other channels. What course of action do you think should be taken?
