I. INTELLIGENCE VALUE

- A. Now. As a free-lance writer, has no first-hand access to material of intelligence value. Has two main collaborators, however, one of whom has suitable cover for doing investigative work all over the Sovzone (low-level OB, factory observation, and the like), and the other of whom has access to certain SED and Freies Deutschland, circles through personal friendships. The former collaborator has shown special talent in photographic work, while the latter has at times been able to report on SED Central Secretariat policy matters.
- B. Subject would be well worth contacting under Fall Pastime conditions. It is by no means certain that the above-mentioned two collaborators would be available to him, but he would be able quickly to adapt himself to changed conditions and would continue to be useful in the fields of OB and political reporting.

II. OPERATIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

A. Present Cover

- 1. Is a free-lance writer with twenty books to his credit, published over a period of twenty years. Has a cover photographic firm in Berlin.
- 2. Lives in furnished apartment, second-floor left, in the British Sector of Berlin, with his secretary-mistress and 10 year-old daughter.
- 3. Journalist-intellectual.
- 4. Made a comfortable living as a writer, now living mainly from his savings.
- 5. Conservative German nationalist, ex-German Army officer, opposed Nazi system, extremely anti-Communist.
