1. Touche. We did not realize that subject was effectively dropped last spring, having been misled by his active efforts on our behalf in mid-Summer (and his appearance, in connection with the PT boat leak this Fall). Neither the fact that he did not act in this PASTIME affair, on our behalf, nor that you intended to have the "girls" handled by someone else, were obvious to us until the receipt of reference.

2. In these circumstances we have of course no objections to make and will ask [ ] to initiate contact with BOMBLES as requested in MOB-A-10595 and agreed to in MOK-A-35134.

3. We would greatly appreciate the opportunity to discuss BOB's staybehind operations with you as a single picture. The reference case was entirely incidental to our suggestion for a general review.

**Recruitment of W/T Operators for Staybehind Activities**

REF: MIRA 9868, NRKW 11603

1. We have been continuing our efforts to obtain a final answer concerning the documents mentioned in first reference memorandum. We are now informed that these documents do not exist at headquarters.

2. There are, however, several Intercept Service Lists available here. These are lists of G-man personnel who, during World War II, were used in DF work, monitoring, etc. They are not strictly speaking W/T people, since they would obviously have a great deal more knowledge of the radio field than an ordinary W/T operator.

3. We can send you the Intercept Service Lists, but those in charge of these lists here are reluctant to do so until several questions have been answered. First, the persons named on these lists are doubtless known, either partially or wholly, by the opposition. Secondly, some of these persons are doubtless being used by other intelligence organizations, including ZASERIM and AFSA. Thirdly, headquarters would wish to know specifically what kind of use would be made of these persons, who would not be suitable for anything more than very short-range work in the staybehind program. Possibly the only use which could be made of them would be to locate new personnel for W/T training.

4. It is also true that these lists should be available at either ZASERIM or AFSA overseas. If you wish to have a look at them, their numbers are as follows: DF-116-AI; DF-116-AK; DF-185-Pts. I, II, & III; DF-219-C; DF-219-D; DF-219-E; and DF-221.

5. We should appreciate having your reactions particularly to Para 3 above. We doubt, however, that these lists would be of any great value in the development of your W/T training program.
