JOSEF ANDERLE:

One of the inmates of the MURMEL-camp is a certain Josef ANDERLE, who is travelling to Czechoslovakia several times every month, without even trying to keep it a secret. In return for payments he is prepared to carry over personal property and luggage of camp-inmates.

Very often, however, he borrows greater amounts of money from the families of emigrants at home, which he fails to account for. He borrowed for instance 5,000 Kcs from (Mrs.) Slava URBALOVA, the mother of Eliška URBALOVA who is at present in MURMEL.

ANDERLE is also in permanent close contact with the representative of the "FRONTA" Movement in Germany, Vladimír POKORNY, for whom he acts as courier to Czechoslovakia.

He is also collecting all newspapers issued by the Czechoslovak emigration, which he takes to Czechoslovakia.

During a visit to the GOTTESBUHL on X'mas 1940, Pfc. Zdenek BEHNER overheard on the corridor a discussion between ANDERLE and another man, when the former declared: "I could take you along to Czechoslovakia, but not back, because the Czech Police are taking me right up to the border by motorcar".

ANDERLE likes to talk a lot about his activities and is presenting himself as a hero of the Resistance-movement.

On the 7th February, on the occasion of a larger social party in his flat, (Mrs.) URBALOVA accused him openly that he was selling information from the emigration to the Ministry of the Interior. ANDERLE was taken aback by her words, but apparently did not take any consequences.
