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## The Czech National Group (Ceska Narodni Skupina) in the camp Valka near Nurnberg.

The situation at the beginning of October 1950.

"The Czech National Group" (Ceska Narodni Skupina - CNS) in the camp Valka declined in summer 1950. With the number of its members amounted to 150. Only a small part of these members, however, were convinced members of this group. The agreement of General PRCHALA with the representatives of the Suleto-Germans caused that many of them left "The Czech National Group". In its report sent to PRCHALA on Aug. 28, 1950, "The Czech National Group" speaks about 168 members, and in the report from Sept. 2, 1950, only about 32 registered members. In fact, the number of the convinced and real members of the CNS in the camp Valka does not exceed 15-16, according other estimates only 7-12. About a half of the members who have left the CNS is still sympathizing with Gen. PRCHALA but they can be characterized as "moderate". The contact of the dissidents with the CNS is performed by fnu CERNAK, former NCO in the garrison at THURTEICH, participant of a prewar attempt of fascist coup d'etat in the C.R., functionary of the former pro-Nazi organization "Viajka". CERNAK, sentenced before the N.V. II to life prison, escaped from the penitentiary to Amazon and came in touch with fnu KRALI, member of the CNS in Munich.

The Committee of the CNS, the chairman of which is Dr. Rudolf WISNER (cover name BRALSKY), former professor of the Masaryk University at Brno, charged with collaboration with Germans during the N.V. II, and secretary fnu KRALI (the former is registered in Valka but is residing in Munich, the latter is employed in Nurnberg most probably with the Americans) tries to win new members but the results of this effort are not so good as formerly because the new coming refugees are informed in due time. In winning new members the Committee of the CNS uses all means, e.g. promising job which is very important in the hard conditions of the refugees. The number of the people employed in Nurnberg and surroundings owing to the effort of the CNS is estimated in about 75. With providing job is entrusted a special commission whose chairman is fnu SEVCIK. The new members of the CNS are won first of all among the persons who have not got the Legal and Political Protection of the IRO, or intend or are compelled to remain in the German economy. Those who have got job with help of the CNS furnish all information about crossing border, about the persons which helped them in crossing border, about the situation in the C.R. and other material usable in the intelligence service.

The furnishing of the information material for the German intelligence service (TLB?) is an important task of the PRCHALA's adherents in the camp Valka. Formerly they furnished this material to the group of Petr NOVAK. When this one had been sentenced for seven years for espionage for the Czechoslovak Communist regime they are in contact with the group MOTTA, headed by Dr. MOTTA, commander of the camp for the Suleto-Germans at KANZELD near Nurnberg who transmit the information to other places. Many people state that this MOTTA is working for the SIB.

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The members of the CIB sent to the GCR receive before crossing border 50 DM, after their return 250 DM, 30 dollars, 5 Care packets and 600 cigarettes. They have to cross the border at least once a month and to return with a positive result. This service is performed by J2, so called reliable members of the CIB, headed by the above mentioned JAVNIK. He is supported in his activity by Frau BLANKENHOFER, wife of the former Nazi attorney, general in Prague who has been executed by hanging in 1945. This BLANKENHOFER is head of the woman section of the PRCHALA's movement and cooperator of Frau FANK LUKY in Munich. Recently she ascertained the names of the new coming Czechoslovak soldiers in Valka. Twelve persons were registered as volunteers for the military units which are allegedly being prepared by Prchala.

It may be said that despite of the decay of the PRCHALA's movement in the course of the last months his adherents develop new activity and try to enlarge the number of their members.

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
