2. Attachment A gives information on Voita MUSIL. The source, M. SYVOUDA of the Czech Exile Press Agency under PRCEALA, is little known here, and the information here presented on MUSIL cannot be evaluated. MOB files contain no information on MUSIL. SYVOUDA claims to have worked for CIC in Vienna in 1950, but was dismissed for "loopying too much about an East-West smuggling operation in which CIC agents were involved." The story sounds highly doubtful.

3. Attachment B gives information on the reactions of various Czech, Slovak and Silesian German organizations to the U. S. reorganization of the Council of the Free CSR. Also contained in this attachment is a report that the PRCEALA group, represented by SYVOUDA, is planning to conduct an investigation of the NOVAK disappearance. SYVOUDA says that NOVAK was representing himself as a member of the PRCHATA group, of which he was actually not a member. SYVOUDA's answer is recorded in paragraph 3. This seems to be an attempt at provocation to elicit information on SYVOUDA's part, a provocation for which did not fall. SYVOUDA also claimed that he is completing a book on Czechoslovakia, which will contain certain facts which the U. S. authorities might consider security information. SYVOUDA will submit a copy of the draft of this book to us for transmittal to someone who can authorize the publication of these facts. This also is regarded by this office as a possible

provocation on SVORODA's part.

4. Attachment C is an, as yet, unconfirmed report on talks between representatives of the Yugoslav Government and Czech exiles in Munich regarding possible united action against the CSR. Opinions are also offered on the disappearance of LAUSMAN and NOVAK, and on the employment of MUSIL by the "German Intelligence Service." To date, we have received no further information on the Titoist-Czech talks, and the report attacks somewhat of a political denunciation made by the CEJMI Group (Anti-Council of the Free CSR) against the PEF'S followers in RFE. However, since one of the sources, VOJTYZKA, is also employed by the RFE, and since he knows that he was reporting this matter to an American (Army) installation with the facilities to check such a report, there may be some elements of truth in this report.
5. Attachment D is a report by PERELSKY on minor happenings within the Czech emigration. Paragraph 4 reports the possible entente between the Czech groups of PERELSKY and CHUDORA.
6. Attachment E is a completely unconfirmed and unevaluated report on CSR border control methods, indicating changes which have occurred since January 1954. The report comes from a Bavarian State police chief stationed near the Bavarian-Czech border.
