Message from Vitava to Jarek containing the following reference to Pekelsky: "I am now also interested in Pekelsky and the whole circle around him. However, I have to work on him during my "time off". I shall send you a complete message concerning the matter. Are you interested in anything particular?"

Letter, Headquarters, United States Air Forces In Europe, Office of Special Investigations, Germany District Office, Munich Detachment, to Co, 1142 USAP Social Activities Squadron (Austria) APO 168, dtd 22 January 1955, Subj: "Vladimir PEKELSKY", in DA 002132, discloses that in late December Pekelaky, leader of Czech Democratic Federalists, had discussions in Munich with Herbert Auberon, English national. Auberon is allegedly working for British Intelligence in an attempt to consolidate the ANN (Anti-Bolshevik Bloc of the Nations) and the East-European organizations-in-exile that are not supported by the US. AR L/28342, 430th CIC Sub-Det "B", dtd 14 April 1953, Subj: "List of Alleged CIC Agents in Vienna, Austria", in DA 002132, discloses CCG intercept L/P 28809, dated 6 March 1953, containing a letter enclosure written by (fnu) Wiedemann to (fnu) Pekelsky, editor of "Bohemia". The envelope was addressed to Redaktion, "Bohemia", 9/11 Dachauerstrasse, Munich, Germany. The enclosure contained a list of alleged CIS agents operating [redacted]

AR L/29551, 430th CIC Sub-Det "B", dtd 9 December, 1953, Subj: "STEINHARDT, Karl, aka GVRK, Karel (CIS), Intelligence Personality", in HQ 08090, discloses the following [redacted]

In April 1953, one Jaroslav Myslivec, from Germany, visited Maria Stodulkova, Camp 1001, Wels, Upper Austria, and gave her copies of the paper "Bohemia", and other printed matter. These items were previously distributed by Vladimir Pekelsky, an employee of the Prohala Group in Germany. (An "Agent's Notes" states that Vladimir Pekelsky, was an operative for an allied intelligence group working out of Germany, and was allegedly replaced by Jaroslav Myslivec). (B-6)

According to Jaroslav Taborek, born 8 March 1895, CSR, the newspaper, "Bohemia" is the official organ of the "Czech Democratic Federalists", and is owned and published by Vladimir Pekelsky in Munich, Germany, who is also chairman of the organization. (E-6)

TRX, Hq 430th CIC Opns to Hq 66th CIC Group (Stuttgart), dated 30 August 1954, discloses that Vladimir Pekelsky controls one Premysl Vorac, refugee, residing in a DP Camp, Wels, Austria. Pekelsky resides at Dachauerstrasse 9/11, Munich, and is allegedly employed by Italian [redacted]

Intelligence. One Frau Pekelsky, same address as above, controls Dr. Jaroslav Kuziaka and Karol Smalchrest, both refugees in Berlin. This net is allegedly working for French intelligence. The Pekelskys are believed to be husband and wife. The request is made for further information available concerning the Pekelskys.

AR L/27144, 430th CIC Sub-Set "B", dtd 18 Aug 1954, Subj: "PEKELSKY Maria nee Blaszowitschova; PEKELSKY, Vladimir, Alleged Intelligence Operatives", in DA-008132, discloses no information concerning the Pekelskys that has not been previously mentioned above.

TWX, 66th CIC Group to OPIA, dtd 7 September 1954, discloses that Vladimir Pekelsky was a source for the 68th CIC Group from 1946 until dropped without prejudice in January 1949. In March 1949 he was dropped with prejudice by TIC. Pekelsky was unmarried as of September 1949, although in October 1951 his business address was reported as Munich, Dachauerstrasse 9/11, where one Frau Pekelska resided. Pekelsky allegedly is the publisher of the Czech newspaper "Bohemia", a publication of the Praha Group, at the above address in 1951. There is no record of any intelligence activity on the part of Pekelsky since December 1952. Frau Pekelska was reported in January 1953 as active in intelligence activities, allegedly travelling to Berlin where she visited the Czech Refugee Camp in Berlin/ Steglitz and talked with Czech inmates.
