Dear Mr. []

I thank you very much for your kind letter of Oct. 21. I agree with you that it will be, perhaps, better to discuss all business here and I hope this will speed up things. In the meantime Mr. [] asked me some questions concerning my boys and they were the same as those you already have asked yet I think this is because this matter is new to him.

In the meantime I have received a letter from the head of the Intelligence Division. As you may be interested in knowing what he wrote about I am sending a copy to you. Their authorities acted very quickly this time. As you already know the boys have got all their papers and, from this point of view, everything has been done I had been asked to. As I understood Mr. Office the only difficulty was that difference in names. Now this difficulty has been removed.

You must not be worried about my income tax. Everything is all right. Seemingly I expressed myself in a wrong manner; the matter is not that I must pay too much but two households in two different countries are a little too much for me. This can not be changed by explanations to the tax authorities but only by making two households a single one.

I have not many news. The University takes much time and I am very glad that time passes quickly as at home I am alone and, therefore, do not like to be there. The climate is beautiful here: it is not so rainy as I expected. On the contrary, we have many sunny days and it is very warm here.

Will you please transmit my greetings to Mr. []
