Dear Professor Poppe,

With regard to your request in your letter of 11 November 1949 for assistance in having your sons join you in this country, I shall be happy to make every effort in this direction. I do not want to encourage you to expect too much too quickly. However, I shall do all that I can toward speeding up the necessary official workings.

Before I can do anything I must have certain facts on which to work. Would you, therefore, give me the following information at your earliest convenience:

1. a brief curriculum vitae for each of your sons, including dates and places of birth, places of residence w'th dates, aliases used and circumstances surrounding their use;
2. citizenship status and their present status in England;
3. all possible information concerning their travel documents-
 - a. type of travel document, e.g., passport, carte d'identite, etc.;
 - b. currently valid visas, indicating issuing country, type of visa, length of validity;
4. all information about applications made to an American consular office or IRO for admission to the United States, indicating dates and places.

When I have all of the information requested above I will be able to proceed. I shall look forward to receiving this material as soon as you are able to assemble it.

I am interested to hear that you are going ahead with the article that we discussed in spite of the limitations you suffer from in the way of source material. I shall be most interested in the result of your effort on this paper.
