<p>Information on subject, <u>General Lev PRCHALA</u>, is extracted verbatim from the above referenced document.</p> <p>"The Center of Prchala's movement is in London and its leader is the former general of the Czechoslovak Army, Lev PRCHALA. His deputy is Dr. f.m. LOCHNER. The tendency and the goal of the movement are fascist, strongly antisocialist and anti-communist; both, communism and socialism are not recognized as political elements to build a state. The movement is no political party and its members are recruited from all political parties, mainly rightist like national democratic, agrarian, tradesmen and even national socialist parties. The purpose for it is to influence the leadership of those parties in the sense of Prchala's political Programme.</p> <p>According to this programme all national minorities in CSR have to get the autonomy, e.g. Germans, Slovaks, Ruthenians, Hungarians and Poles. It is why the leader of the movement in Germany MJC f.m. PEKELSKY has contacted the Sudetic Germans and negotiates with MP LODGMANN a MP LORITZ about the question of Sudetic Germans. Pekelsky pretends the appearance of the Czech representative in Germany and asks the punishment for the Czechoslovak refugees who presumably committed the inhuman crimes at the time of the transfer of the German population from Sudetenland (the case of Kreups Frantisek, published in German papers is Pekelsky's initiative).</p> <p>(Continued on page 2)</p>

In Munich, where the center of the movement in Germany is residing, a certain opposition against this political tactic arised and some members were excluded from the movement (the case of Jakub Grosser). This opposition is mainly caused by the fact that the leadership of the movement is in the greater part in hands of people who collaborated with the Germans during the occupation of Czechoslovakia, ware sentenced to the jail and fled from the country or from the prison or before they started to serve the sentence. The rest, honest people, are refusing to be under leadership of these former collaborators with the Germans.

The press center of the movement for Germany is in Munich. The editor is a certain Horak, presumably member of the People's party, former resident of the DP-camp at Ludwigsburg. In the last 6 weeks no paper or other propaganda material appeared; the movement is without any financial resources. Before that time Prchala received 1000 British pounds for an article he let to be printed defending J. Eata's behavior during the last war.
