Request to PBCHORD Employee to Become Informant

ACTION REQUIRED: None. For your information.

1. Recently a PBCHORD employee reported that he had been contacted by a Russian who asked him to inform on emigres and Americans at PBCHORD. The employee received this proposition twice; the second time he declined and threatened to call the police if the proposal were made again. We are transmitting the PBCHORD report of this matter (CAM 5-58) under separate cover for your information.

2. We have not been able to identify the person who made the offer to the PBCHORD employee -- nor the friend of the employee who served to introduce the stranger to the PBCHORDER. We note in our files only that SHUBA 284 has the same name as the individual who made the proposition. An identity is extremely unlikely; it will be noted, moreover, that the spelling of the two names which we attempted to trace is questionable.   office, too, was unable to provide more identifying information than that which is cited in CAM 5-58.

Approximately one and one-half to two months ago, Subject was awakened around midnight by a person who calls himself Viktor BUIROV with whom he is acquainted through a friend, Dmitri SHEVCHENKO (these names have been transliterated into the English spelling). BUIROV asked Subject about KROMIADI and said that he was interested in information on emigre and American personnel at Radio Liberation and asked Subject if he would help him to get it; subject said that he would think the matter over. Subject said that he reported this to  at the time.

On 9 February 1958, Subject ran into BUIROV by chance in Munich. He was asked if he was prepared to do the work as they had discussed previously. Subject said "no" and threatened to notify the police if he were bothered any further. Subject has stated that both SHEVCHENKO and BUIROV are known to the Emigre Relations Office of the American Committee. A check of the Emigre Relations mailing list reveals that the following two names seem to correspond:
