Alexander Alexandrovich Makash, Russian, 37 years old, well dressed, gives a New York address, allegedly works for United Nations, passing through Munich on his way to Egypt. Allegedly lived in the USSR until 1943 when he went to Vienna and studied at the Music Conservatory. 1953 to Munich and later to United States.

He called Mr. Karov by telephone saying that he had read several of Karov's articles and would like to talk to him. He visited Karov for approximately two hours. Makash said that he spoke four languages including French and English. Karov, who speaks French fluently and some English tested him in both and learned that he could not speak French. Makash asked many questions about life in Munich, etc. Many factors made him suspicious to Karov.

Mr. Czeby writes to Mr. Stewart as follows:
an estimate

*Very important to
L. W. Armstrong*

"Tadeusz Rogowski has a close friend, Lubim P. Kosakewitz
who lives in Korntal (near Stuttgart). He is always on the
move through West Germany distributing Gospel tracts. In the camp
Malmshain, Kreis Leonberg, Rogowski arranged a meeting with
Kosakewitz and a number of other prisoners in the camp room.
Before their parting both Rogowski and Kosakewitz prayed to God with
tears in their eyes. After the meeting they went to Rogowski's room
where Kosakewitz passed the night."

Next day Czeby asked Rogowski why he so ardently prayed at the
Gospel meetings. *while* Rogowski told him that he was an atheist.
Besides this, he surely sent all the addresses to the Committee
in East Berlin? Rogowski answered: "You don't know our tricks; who now
can say that I am a Communist who sent their addresses to Berlin?"

Czeby says that this is only one little example of the Bolshevik
agents' work. They look like saints and perform devilish work.

Korntal
The police took Czeby to court and sent him to Leonberg,
he doesn't know anything.

In his second letter dated September 12, 1952, Czeby writes about
an organization in Korntal, of which he sends Mr. Stewart a fragment
of its envelope. On the top of the envelope is the following stamp:
"Bibelheim und Bibelchale, Heilingsberg, Kreis Leonberg". The envelope
is addressed to: "Hilfsdienst zur Verbreitung des Evangeliums, Korntal bei
Stuttgart, Poststr. 4". The address is the same as Mr. Stewart's, Poststr. 15,
Leonberg".

Czeby writes that he will keep Mr. Stewart an eye on
Stewart to watch over this organization (in the envelope) which correspond
with East Germany.

In his third letter dated September 13, 1949, Czeby gives the following names and addresses :

Czeby stresses that the above named men were friends. It is possible that they have other friends, but for the present Czeby only knows about these four men. He adds that Mr. Dick corresponds with East Germany.
