1. Recently Headquarters received a report from which contained a list of former employees of REMOON who returned to the USSR and who made public statements regarding American activities in Munich, and a second list of current REMOON employees who allegedly maintain a relationship with the KIS. While the first list was not all inclusive and contained no new information, it was fairly accurate in so far as it covered the subject. The information was provided by QUANTUM-1 who obtained it from Sam GUMNOV, described only as a "White Russian", and a casual, unpaid informant (presumably in the Madrid area).

2. We are forwarding the second list under separate cover for your information. While there is nothing particularly significant in this report, we found it interesting in that information of this type has reached us from Madrid, that certain of the individuals such as Mikhail KUMAROV and Boris KUMAROV have been suspected by REMOON for a long period, and that aliases listed for several of the individuals are unknown to REMOON. You will note also that KUMAROV-1's name appears on this list.

3. Has MEM or its informant assets any guess as to the possible identity of GUMNOV?

List of Employees (Collaborators) at Radio Liberation, Munich Suspected of Maintaining Relations with the Russian Services.

1. **KHRENKOV, Anatole.** Collaborator at the Radio, fled to Austria in 1956 (in contact with the Soviet agent, **VISHNEV** in Stockholm.) (Headquarters Comment: **KHRENKOV** is actually an ex-employee, having worked as a script writer at the Radio from January 1957 to January 1959. We have no information on **VISHNEV**).
2. **SEREBIA, Aschet aka NERUNIAN.** Friend of G. **AVALIANI** who returned to Russia.
3. **KHOKI, Vladimir aka BUDITSKIY,** true name **TOUKIN.** Intimate friend of the Soviet, **BOGOMIN (Leonid).** Byelorussian editor. (Headquarters Comment: We have no record that **KHOKI-BUDITSKIY** ever used the name **TOUKIN**; nor are there any traces on this name).
4. **BOKINOV, Pavel.**
5. **BERKOV** (actually listed as **BERKOV**), Boris. Friend of Boris **VINGRADOV.**
6. **BAVNI aka OSTROVSKIN;** speaker at the Radio, replacing **VINGRADOV**, the Communist. (Headquarters Comment: We have no information to indicate that Georgiy **OSTROVSKIN** was ever known by this name or ever used this name).
7. **BRASOVSKIY, Mikhail,** Suspected by German Security Services.
8. **GAMBURIN, Sergei aka Viktor ANDERSON.** Former war prisoner who has returned to Russia.
9. **FILAYEV, (Leonid) aka PAVLOVSKIY.** One of the editors of the Radio, friend of **VINGRADOV.** He received a visit from Mrs. **VINGRADOV** when she passed through Munich.
10. **MAKIN,** The younger refugee. Member of the Komsomol.

In this list **FRISCHENSKIY aka Mikhail KARTACHEV** who replaced (Lt. Ivan) **OVCHINKIN** (who returned to Russia) as editor of the Army broadcast is also found. The similarity between these two Soviet officials (from the point of view of their characteristics) is as follows: Like O, F was also an official of Navy Intelligence, speaks -- as O does, German and English, is well educated, knows well all details of the situation in the West etc. Although no proof exists with which to accuse him, it is believed that he was sent to Munich especially by the Soviets. Like the before mentioned O, he is a member of the **Presidium of ISDE.** (Headquarters Comment: To the best of our knowledge, **OVCHINKIN** had no Navy connections. **FRISCHENSKIY** has not been known by the **KARTACHEV** alias).
