<p>1. We are transmitting under separate cover a PBCHORD memorandum dated 18 March 1959. This report tells of the receipt of a letter by Anatolij MICHELSON from the Committee for the Return to the Homeland. The letter was addressed to MICHELSON's new Dortmund address which was allegedly known to only four people, among whom was Alexander DOLBERG who moved into MICHELSON's Munich apartment when MICHELSON left for Dortmund. In this connection it is interesting to note that DOLBERG has reported strange phone calls and visits since he moved into MICHELSON's former Munich residence. For detailed information on these calls and visits please see EGMA 40581 of 19 February 1959 (attachment I, paragraph 2 and attachment J, paragraph 88).</p> <p>2. The sender of the letter to MICHELSON is noted as W. DEGTJAREW, with the usual Schadowstrasse return address in Berlin. The PBCHORD Security Officer would appreciate any information which the Berlin Base might have on W. DEGTJAREW. Munich Base has no clearly identifiable traces on this individual, but we note that BRLN 1615 of January 1959 listed a V.P. DEGTJAREV as a member of the Secretariat of the Committee for the Return to the Homeland in East Berlin.</p>

MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: Anatolij MICHELSON

DATE: 18 Mar 1959

I was recently furnished by Max RALIS a copy of a letter received by MICHELSON at his new address in Dortmund from the Committee for Return to the Homeland. The fact that MICHELSON should hear from the Committee for Return to the Homeland is not in itself out of the ordinary; however, under the circumstances such as they are, it appears to take on a somewhat more unusual note. The letter was addressed to MICHELSON at his Dortmund address, an address which, at the time he received the letter, was allegedly known only to Max RALIS, Victor FRANK, and to me. In addition, I have ascertained that DOLBERG moved into MICHELSON's apartment when he left this area and there is the possibility that DOLBERG knew his forwarding address in Dortmund or possibly even MICHELSON's landlord may have had his new Dortmund address. In addition, we have been unable, as yet, to determine to whom in Dortmund MICHELSON may have furnished his new address. At any rate the letter addressed to MICHELSON encloses a letter alleged to be from his brother still in the Soviet Union and in this letter his brother exhorts MICHELSON to give up his life in the West and return to his family in the Soviet Union. The sender is listed as W. DEGTJAREW and he uses the regular return address, Schadowstrasse, in Berlin.

Although I have absolutely no other information concerning him, would it be possible for you to check your files and possibly Berlin on this W. DEGTJAREW for whatever information may be available on him. In addition, I will keep you posted on my efforts to ascertain from whence the Committee for Return to the Homeland may have received MICHELSON's new address.
