<p>1. You will recall that during the recent meeting of the Psychological Operations Panel (POP) in Munich, a representative of FECHORD briefed the participants on the FECHORD mailing and hand-to-hand distribution program for the USSR. The USAREUR representative pointed out that the Army regularly offers group tours to the USSR for its personnel and the question was raised whether such official "tourists" might properly augment the FECHORD program to the USSR by taking in and leaving behind selected literature. While it was agreed that FECHORD should not cooperate directly with Army authorities in such a program, it was suggested that <input type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/> and FECHORD draw up a pilot proposal.</p> <p>2. FECHORD has drafted the attached proposal as to how official tourists might contribute to the literature distribution program without embarrassment to themselves or the Army, and without FECHORD involvement. Such a program would by necessity be Army sponsored and worked into the Army briefing of tour groups. FECHORD's name must not be mentioned. The literature would have to be purchased and made available through Army channels. FECHORD has agreed to pay up to a maximum of \$200.00 for the cost of the literature on any pilot run, but it should be strictly understood that its commitment to underwrite is limited to a one-time pilot operation. <input type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/> can submit vouchers to <input type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/> for payment via NUBARK channels. Should such an operation be singularly successful, we can review future possibilities with FECHORD's Munich and New York offices and with KUWOLF.</p> <p>3. 2. The briefing could include an oral (not written) statement something like the following:

On the seat of your bus or plane you will find a small package of paperback books and magazines. These are a gift for your own personal use from the travel agency which arranged your trip. You will find, however, that the Soviet citizens you meet will be as interested in your country as you are in theirs and will, therefore, be interested in these American paperback books or magazines. You may choose to give some of them to Soviet citizens you meet, you may choose simply to leave them in your hotel room, when you have finished reading them, but in any case, you can be sure that they will be read with interest by the Soviet citizens who acquire them.

As Soviet citizens are avid and enthusiastic readers, you may even make friends who would like other books as gifts which you will want to mail them after you return to the West.
