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

We appreciate your comments concerning the Ukrainian program. This activity represents an important part of our operational effort to reach non-Russian groups in the Soviet Union. We have been seeking to maximize the impact of our program within existing appropriations. We have yet to identify any funds in this fiscal year to supplement those already committed to the program and, with the tightness of our budget, I am not very optimistic. In fact, in looking to the out years of Fiscal 1980 and 1981 and the guidance levels imposed by OMB, the program may suffer, if not from a reduction in the level of funds presently available, then from inflation alone. (S)

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

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

I was impressed with the comments made by Ukrainian dissident Valentyn Moroz on the effectiveness of the Ukrainian publication and book distribution program which CIA supports. His comments provide authoritative evidence that the funds you allocate to this program are well spent. We need to continue to try to find more money for the entire book and publication program targeted at the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe. Can you give me a status report of the prospects for additional funds you mentioned in your memorandum to me of April 9, 1979? (S)

SUBJECT: Interview with Valentyn Moroz

DATE:

1. I thought you would be interested in recent evidence that we received of the success of our program in the Ukraine. I received the following two paragraphs from our Ukrainian contacts. (S)

2. "In an interview with Prolog, Moroz stated that Suchasnist was held in high regard by Ukrainian dissidents and that the magazine has the reputation of being the finest Ukrainian periodical published in the West. Moroz has read Suchasnist since the early 1960's and he personally considers the publication to be the most authoritative voice in the Ukrainian emigre press. He was particularly impressed with the journal's efforts to publicize the adverse effects of Russification in the Ukraine, and to educate Ukrainian youth on Ukrainian history, literature and culture. Moroz was also acquainted with various books published by Suchasnist publishers and mentioned that these publications are being circulated in Ukraine. (S)

"Moroz stressed that books are the most important aspect of providing support for the Ukrainian movement, that there is a great demand for them, and that Suchasnist publishers should exert every effort to distribute as many books into Ukraine as possible. SUBJECT: Interview with Valentyn Moroz (S)

1. This memorandum informs you of a recent interview with Valentyn Moroz, the Ukrainian dissident, concerning the activities of an Agency-supported Ukrainian emigre publishing house, Prolog Research Corporation, and its monthly publication, Suchasnist. This magazine, which contains literary, historical and political works on Ukrainian affairs, is infiltrated into the Ukrainian SSR to provide intellectual and moral support to those Ukrainians inside the USSR who seek moderation of the Soviet political system. (S)

2. In an interview with Prolog, Moroz stated that Suchasnist was held in high regard by Ukrainian dissidents and that the magazine has the reputation of being the finest Ukrainian periodical published in the West. Moroz has read Suchasnist since the early 1960's and he personally considers the publication to be the most authoritative voice in the Ukrainian emigre press. He was particularly impressed with the journal's efforts to publicize the adverse effects of Russification in the Ukraine, and to educate Ukrainian youth on Ukrainian history, literature and culture. Moroz was also acquainted with various books published by Suchasnist publishers and mentioned that these publications are being circulated in Ukraine. (S)

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

SUBJECT: Book and Publication Program for Eastern  
Europe and the Soviet Union (S)

Thank you for the excellent, comprehensive report on CIA's book and publications programs targeted at Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union which you transmitted to me on 14 March 1979. Additional funds allocated to these programs since we decided on expansion of them in 1977 have produced impressive dividends. I am struck by the concrete evidence you are able to produce of the impact on specific audiences in the target area. (S)

I am disturbed, however, to hear that the steady expansion of this program approved by the SCC in 1977 is projected to cease in FY 1980, when it appears that there will actually be a reduction in total expenditure and a net reduction in most of the individual activities that comprise this program. This is neither cost-effective--given the expansion that has already taken place--nor in accord with basic policy. The Soviet Union and Eastern Europe are our highest-priority targets for sustained covert action impact. Money to permit continued expansion of this entire program during FY 1980 should be found through reprogramming. (S)
