1. General Nicolas Radescu has entrusted to Colonels Dan Ivanovici and Tomorveanu the task of organizing former Rumanian army officers in France in his support. General Platon Chirnoaga, an Iron Guardist, has been given the same task in Germany and Austria. Chirnoaga, who is assisted by Colonel Alexandrescu in Munich and Major Bumbagescu in Rastatt, was recently in Paris. He has received a Titre de Voyage from the French and an exit visa to Argentina, but planned instead to return clandestinely to Austria.
2. General Ion Gheorghe has left on an undisclosed mission to Germany following conferences with Generals Radescu and Chirnoaga.
