* Excerpt of pertinent information : 1. The following information, concerning the Rumanian General PETRESCU, was reported from Paris on 5 May 1950. According to a Rumanian who is close to RADESCU and who is also acquainted with Petrescu, the latter arrived in France from Yugoslavia via Germany about six months ago, having left Rumania early in 1949.

3. It appears that Petrescu was a career army officer and a friend of RADESCU. In fact, he is stated to have been a member as a Vice-Minister in Radescu's Government at Bucharest. When he got to France, he immediately contacted Radescu and later informed his friends that he was to be charged with certain political activities in France, organization of military and others in the emigration, and would receive \$400 monthly from Radescu.

4. However, this plan, or rather the money, did not materialize.
