1. Karlsruhe files contain the following information on persons and organizations mentioned in reference memo and on whom you requested transfer:

a. BOGDANOVICH: Probably identical with (Maj.) BOGDANOWICZ mentioned in paragraph 4 of NOVA-872 attached hereto.

b. CHEMNY KOT (Black Cat) - Num-440, dated 14 March 1947: Chemny Kot is a terrorist organization in USSR which is in contact with the German nationalist underground in Russian zone. Possesses a courier service from the Russians to USSR. Offered contact to SB/OUN.

c. KBV (KBN): Karpus Bezpieczenstwa Wewnętrznege (Internal Security Corps) Polish. Information in our files is dated and does not agree on all points, especially as to the origin of the KBV, but it is being forwarded for your information as requested in reference memorandum:

(1) S-1370, dated 23 Jan. 46:

(a) The Internal Security Corps (KBV) is subordinate to the Minister for Internal Security (BARKIEWICZ). Following is a list of personnel of the KBV:

Commanding General: (Lt. Col. WENTON (Soviet Officer))  
Deputy Commanding Gen.: (Col. RODZON, alias SOKARSKI (Jew from Spanish International Brigade))  
Chief of Staff: (Col. WILKINSKI (Soviet Officer))  
Chief of Signals: (Lt. Col. WANKOWSKI, alias WILKICHENKO, A.)  
Staff Officer: (Maj. BOGDANOVICH (Jew))

Headquarters for the KBV is located at Warsaw, in barracks of former A.A. Artillery Reg. at corner of Pulawska and Rakowicka Streets. They have a training center at Andrzejew, near Lodz. The KBV includes 15 regiments, of which two motorized regiments are at Warsaw and Krakow respectively and 10 independent Special Battalions, of which five are motorized.

The regiments are located at Krakow, Katowice, Wroclaw, Warszawa, Lublin, Jastkow, Bialystok, Bagnow, Kois, Bydgoszcz, Stargard (Near Stettin), Bamsig, Gora Kalwaria, and Kielce.

(b) The battalions are located at Melany (near Warsaw), Pomnan, Jozikarna (near Warsaw), Bialystok, and other places not known.

(c) The existence of several Cavalry Regiments of the KBW has been reported:

2nd Cavalry Reg. KBW - Jastkow
8th " " " - Kielce
13th " " " - region of Stettin
15th " " " - Wroclaw (Breslau)

Probably these regiments are only "Cavalry Regiments" in name because some regiments have no horses, and others have from 20 to 30 horses only.

(d) The Commanding Officer of the 1st Motorized Regiment is (Col.) POZAPOYICH (Soviet Officer). Second in Command is (Major) KOZINSKI (Jew). The CO of the 15th Regiment KBW at Wroclaw is (Colonel) RUBINSTEIN (Jew - Soviet Officer).

(2) SO BS 7880, undated and showing no evaluation, states that the KBW was formed in May 1945 from some Polish sabotage and diversion units which had operated under Russian control behind the German lines in 1944 and consisted of about 15 regiments with a total strength of approximately 50,000 men. The KBW was under the control of RAKINWICZ, *see Stanislaw* Minister of Public Security. The commander of the KBW was one General KIMENWICZ, a Russian of Polish extraction. Each KBW regiment has on its staff a Political Education Officer who is usually a Russian and who is responsible for the loyalty of the unit. In addition, the KBW Officers' School at Iagnica has a Russian, (Colonel) WUKONSKI, *see (1947)* in command. The headquarters staff and the staff of each regiment has an "intelligence officer" whose primary function is handling of counterintelligence matters.

(3) According to a report dated 20 July 1946 (IA-873), evaluated C-3, the KBW came into being shortly after the conclusion of hostilities, when the 4th "Kilinski" Inf. Div. was converted en masse into the Internal Security Corps. The headquarters of KBW was located on Pulawska and Rakowiecka Streets in Warsaw, and was commanded by (Gen) Bronislaw KILINSKI. The 10th Regt. of the 4th "Kilinski" Inf. Div. became the 1st Mts. KBW Regt.; the 11th Inf. Regt. became the 8th Independent KBW Bn. and was stationed in Warsaw. The KBW also consisted of the 16th Regt. under Col. *see* RUBINSTEIN, and the 2nd Mts Regt.

(4) F-5287, dated 20 Oct. 1945, evaluated C-2, states that the KBW consisted of one corps and that it was proposed to organize two more corps of two regiments each. Each regiment to consist of one infantry company, three cavalry squadrons and one signal company.

(5) A report dated 23 March 1946, from the SGI Det., Munich, stated that the KBW, Home Defense Corps, was under the Ministry of Home Security, MN. The report further stated that the KBW was a policy-making body, and, among other things, supervised and directed the activities of the KBW, Home Defense Troops.

(6) MAH-76 from Vienna, dated 19 March 1947, evaluated F-3, reported that the KBW had the responsibility of anti-partisan operations in the field and described the KBW as a well-equipped and politically reliable elite formation which resembled the Waffen SS or the KVD Internal Troops.

d. MALINOWSKI, Zbigniew

(1) One from MALINOWSKI (probably identical with Boris MALINOWSKI) was reported in MUEI-157 of 7 June 1946 as a SIS agent with SOBIEKO. He works in a DP warehouse in Munich.

(2) SIS-45 (May 1949) reported one Capt. MALINOWSKI, SIS Officer (Tagliche Rundschau) in Berlin, Russians.

(3) MCKA-12233 of 17 Nov. 1949 describes one MALINOWSKI (MALINOVSKI), Soviet Captain, who was a SIS officer in Berlin in Jan. 1949.

e. RAGULA (REGULA)

(1) MCHA-886, dated 8 November 1948, forwarded a report on one Boris RAGULA, alias REGULA, Boris, prepared by Intelligence Div., BUCK. Information given is as follows:

(a) About 2 September 1948, RAGULA, a student at Marburg University, Marburg, Germany, and leader of White Ruthenian student organizations in Western Europe, left for Belgium with the intention of establishing the headquarters of the movement there, believing there were greater possibilities for the movement and work in Belgium than in Germany. RAGULA in a letter from Belgium to his wife in Marburg, Germany gave his Belgian address as B. RAGULA, 19 R.S. Donay, Flenmalle-Liege, Belgium. He intended to continue his studies at the University of Louvain.

(b) RAGULA was born 1 Jan. 1930 in Turits, Poland and has been living in Marburg, Germany since 17 Oct. 1945. His career included service in the Polish Army in 1939 and underground activities with the White Russian National Movement, White Ruthenian Independence Party, and the White Ruthenian National Council. He came to Germany in 1944 and joined Radziow Ostrowski's White Ruthenian Central Committee, training as a Major with a White Ruthenian Division at Grafenwehr. He is presently (date of report) active in White Ruthenian Veterans' League and is believed to have excellent connections with White Ruthenian emigre leaders as Nikolai ABRAMOV of Paris, France.

(c) Comment at the end of this report was that REGULA may be useful to Belgian or other Western intel. services, as he is above average intelligence, strongly anti-Communist and <sup>is</sup> has had considerable experience in anti-Soviet counter intelligence work with White Ruthenian

groups. However, he should not be recommended unconditionally as he is egotistic, ambitious and primarily interested in furthering White Ruthenian nationalism.

(2) VMB-1202, dated 27 Dec. 1948:

(a) Stated that although subject was expected to come to Belgium, he was not listed on the registry of foreigners in Belgium nor did his name appear on the population list of the commune of Fiemalla-Grande in which the address given in paragraph 1 a above is located. Also his dossier at the Police des Etrangers did not give any present address.

(b) Further, that the Council of Belgium Administration of Aid to Slavic-Oriental University students (COBASOU) granted on 5 Oct. 1948 a scholarship to subject and his sister, Ludmila BAKULA.

(3) MSEA-2737, dated 14 July 1949, reported one BAKULA, Boris (Major). See attached copy of MSEA-2737.

1. Forwarded herewith is a copy of secret Personality Report, Region V, Regensburg, file V-2234.200, Subject above, dated 22 June 1949.

2. If interested in Subjects' services there are two people who might know of his present whereabouts and method by which contact may be established. These people are as follows:

- a. Mikolai ABRAMCHIK, reported as living in Paris, France and being the leader of the BNR and White Russian Government-in-Exile.
- b. Josefa BRZCZKO, former radio operator of Subject during the war, and reported to be residing at the Windersbergersdorf White Russian DP Camp near Cham.

3. CIC has directed Region V to exploit the lead concerning the present location of BRZCZKO in an effort to obtain all possible information as to the present location of Subject, full details as to his background activities, and the manner by which he can be contacted.

4. Request that we be notified soonest if a continued investigation by CIC is desired and whether or not we have any interest in exploiting Subject in the event he can be located. If the information contained in the enclosed report can be verified by our organization, it will be appreciated by CIC.
