MUNICH, GERMANY (AP)-SWITZERLAND TODAY EXPELLED ERICH RAJAKOVIC, THE MAN ACCUSED IN HOLLAND OF ORGANIZING THE MASS KILLING OF DUTCH JEWS FOR THE NAZIS IN WORLD WAR II. HE ARRIVED HERE BY PLANE AND WAS PLACED UNDER POLICE SUPERVISION. THE BAVARIAN INTERIOR MINISTRY SAID IT WILL DECIDE LATER WHETHER HE SHOULD BE EXPELLED FROM GERMANY.

MUNICH, GERMANY--WEST GERMAN AUTHORITIES LAUNCHED A MANHUNT TODAY FOR ERICH RAJAKOWITSCH, WHO ALLEGEDLY HELPED ADOLF EICHMANN ROUND UP AUSTRIAN AND DUTCH JEWS FOR TRANSPORTATION TO NAZI DEATH CAMPS. RAJAKOWITSCH WAS RECOGNIZED YESTERDAY WHEN HE DISEMBARKED FROM A PLANE WHICH ARRIVED FROM SWITZERLAND.

A BAVARIAN INTERIOR MINISTRY SPOKESMAN SAID AUTHORITIES "HAD NO GROUNDS TO ARREST HIM THEN AND HE WAS ALLOWED TO LEAVE THE TERMINAL." LATER, THE FEDERAL INTERIOR MINISTRY IN BONN DECLARED RAJAKOWITSCH AN UNDESIRABLE ALIEN.

A MUNICH POLICE SPOKESMAN SAID LATE LAST NIGHT, "IT'S AS THOUGH HE'S BEEN SWALLOWED UP BY THE EARTH."
