REF :

1. Attached are Agent Service Records on Subjects. CAISSON 10a, courier to CAISSON 10, had reported earlier in the month that the latter had been subjected to a brief interrogation and house search by the German Criminal Police in Frankfurt/Oder. At that time he was asked about his occasional trips to Berlin, but the matter was not pressed. On 20 January 1949, CAISSON 10 was taken off the station platform where he was employed as porter and shiner of shoes, and put to work in the station restaurant as a waiter, a calling which was his regular one before the war. This transfer made it impossible for him to continue his intelligence-gathering activities for us, and he was dropped, effective the end of January, along with CAISSON 10a, his courier.

2. CAISSON 10 has never given us a satisfactory explanation for his apparently erroneous report stating that the railroad bridge at Frankfurt is double-tracked, but as far as I know there have been no glaring holes in his railroad watching reports on the whole. Possibly he became frightened at the police investigation directed at him, and decided to terminate his activities for us gracefully. Another possibility is that the Soviets were really suspicious of him, and unable or unwilling to take the time to pin anything on him, decided to remove him from regular sight of the railway traffic going through the yard. However this may be, we have no choice in the matter, and must record him as dropped.
