(LOCAL AGENCY) On 1 October 1968, the records of the Berlin Document Center, West Berlin (UU9220), APO New York 09742, caused to be examined by Wheaton B. Byers, Director, revealed the following information concerning one Franz Reimeringer who likely is identical to SUBJECT:



Education:		Two years German grammar school and nine years French grammar school. Completed one semester of law as of January 1943.	
Skills:		a. As railroad employee: traffic control, cashier, and disciplinary matters b. As SD Desk Officer: German, French, English, Spanish, and Italian translations and writing	
Military Service:		1928 to 1929 - French Navy September 1939 to August 1940 - Interpreter/Lieutenant, French Army. Stationed as intelligence officer in Cameroons.	
Remarks:		Reimeringer indicated that he had been born a German national, but had to accept French citizenship as a result of the Treaty of Versailles. He was demobilized from the French Army in October 1940 and immediately applied to the French authorities for permission to return to Alsace. He received no answer to his request and he went without the necessary papers to Moulins, France, near the demarcation line and reported to a German office. From there he was sent on to Alsace. He and his wife remained there, residing in Sulz with his parents-in-law, until February 1941. During that period, Reimeringer applied for a position with the SD and the German railroad. He received no reply. He then submitted a request to the Military Commander (German) in France for permission to travel to Vichy, France, and Dakar, West Africa, to get his personal belongings and some money due him. When this request was refused, he took it upon himself to travel illegally to Vichy via Belfort-Champagnol. The Colonial Office in Vichy immediately sent him to Thies, Senegal, where he had to work as a railroad inspector. He was not in agreement with this and in February 1942 he returned to Marseilles, France, where he applied to the Returnee Office of the Armistice Commission at Clermont-Ferrand, for permission to return to Alsace. He received instructions to report to the German authorities at the demarcation line. Reimeringer and his wife then went to Issoudun, France, and reported to a German sub-headquarters in Vierzon, France. On crossing the demarcation line, Reimeringer applied for work with the SD by whom he was still employed in June 1943 (the latest date in the file). In an official letter from the GESTAPO Office, SD Headquarters, Orleans, France, dated 24 August 1942, to the Representative of the Reichs Commissioner for the Determination of German Nationality, Reimeringer was described as an outstanding employee who was working as an interpreter and technical assistant. Further, that he had demonstrated an interest and ability in the SD field and had expressed the desire to be an official with the SD rather than

work for the railroad. He was cited for his clear and positive attitude towards the German government as opposed to the imperfections of the Alsace-Lorraine citizens. The letter indicated that it was desired that he become an SD employee, where, due to his linguistic capabilities, he would be more valuable than with the railroad. Employment by the SD would be dependent on the granting to Reimeringer of German citizenship. It was asked that the office be informed as to what could be done in Reimeringer's case. The office requested that any approval for Reimeringer to return to Alsace be withheld until he had been employed by the GESTAPO which would be arranged by the writer (signature illegible). On an EWZ file card it was indicated that Reimeringer wanted to remain an employee of the SD and to work in either Baden, the Rhineland area, or Alsace. On 23 April 1943, Reimeringer's resettlement to Georgenweg, Sulz, Kreis Gebweiler, was approved. A note in the file dated 3 June 1943, indicated that though there were no reservations about Reimeringer being settled in Lorraine, the certificate should be for Alreich (Old Reich) as his presence in Lorraine was not wanted due to his voluntary leaving there in 1941.

AGENT'S NOTES: A picture of Reimeringer and of his wife are on file. The name "Maria" was written on a card pertaining to Reimeringer and in such a manner that it could be mis-read as "Mona." This entry referred to Reimeringer's sister/sisters.
