1. Due to an oversight on our part an information copy of Reference and Attachment were not forwarded to your Base. We are correcting this by transmitting a copy of the Attachment at this time; the Reference cover letter was merely a transmittal note.
2. We would like to underline the fact that according to the attached GEMVY Report the suspected RUS agent Alexandra STASCHY - EBEBOTOV has been introduced "into several diplomatic circles in Munich."
3. According to the book These Names Accuse (published by "The Latvian National Fund in the Scandinavian Countries" in Stockholm, Sweden in 1951), which contains a nominal list of Latvians deported from Latvia to Soviet Russia in 1940 and 1941, we find that Aleksandra EBEBOTOV born 17 October 1910 and Vasilij EBEBOTOV born 1912, whose last residence in Latvia had been Rungu iela (street) 1-10, Riga, were deported during this period of time.
4. Since Munich Operations Base has all the biographical information on EBEBOTOV's contact Douvo REBERBERER, we are at this time providing a summary of the same for the benefit of Vienna Station:

 Other : Arrived in Riga, Latvia in 1919 from Russia  
 Studied at Russian Juridical Faculty, Prague, Czechoslovakia from 1922-1925  
 Received PhD in Law at the Juridical Faculty at Latvian University in Riga, Latvia  
 Interpreter and translator at the German Foreign Office in Berlin, Germany from 1939-1945  
 Subject was tried by German Court in July 1946 and was found guilty of homosexuality  
 In June 1949 MOB intended to use Subject as a Research analyst and translator from Russian, Latvian and German into English. However, MOB cancelled the use of Subject  
 IRO legal officer in 1951 and 1952 in Germany.
