After his arrival at LUDWIGSBURG Subject found a room by
family DAUNER, Hofenstr. 35. The information supplied by the Criminal
Police Commissar Mr. SEYERLE, is following :

Subject escaped when Soviet troops reconquered Poland (1944-45).
While he could not contact his relatives, his wife and parents remained
there. He does not have any contact with them, and does not know whether
they are still alive or have been deported by Russians.

The possible reason for his escape was that he had collaborated
with German Occupation Forces, and that he was a anti-communist.

For the present time Subject is a member of the Ukrainian Liberation
Committee in Germany. He has told many times to Mr. DAUNER that he is afraid
of communists, and that he would like to devote his life for fight against
this menace. His brother was an active partisan after the World War II and
died in his wounds.

According to information received from reliable resources Subject
has a very good character. He is open-minded, honest, ready to help and
a good comrade. For the present time he is working as a teacher in the IRO
Camp (Luitpold Caserne) at LUDWIGSBURG. He is spending his free time en-
tirely at home. Sometimes he receives visitors - mostly his countrymen -
and serves them tea and sandwiches. He does not drink any alcoholic drinks.
His room, poorly furnished, is always clean and in good order. He washes
and repairs his underwear himself. Saves money.

Subject does not have any connections with women. He has stayed
true to his wife and is very much longing for him. Subject is worried about
his future while IRO is closing very soon. Once he mentioned that he will
be given a job by the US Occupation Forces at STUTTGART. Later it appeared
that this job did not materialize. After that he told that he has received
an offer from MUNICH. No detailed information available about the nature of
this job. Subject is confident that his good knowledge of languages and his
anti-communist attitude will guarantee him a job with the US Occupation
Forces soon or later. In case he would not get a job here, he would like
to go to BELGIUM or FRANCE.
