Mr. KIMBALL RUDKO has been a member of the test administering and interviewing staff of the Labor Assessment Unit since 15 December 1951. His services during this period have been excellent in every respect. The quality of his work, his devotion to the job, and his reliability have at all times been above reproach.

The Labor Assessment Unit has been a Department of the Army entity, established in May, 1951 by Headquarters MACOM (OPOT, G-3) and assigned to Munich Military Post for principal logistical support. The mission and activities of this unit have been to develop and conduct vocational aptitude and interests studies on selected GPs and refugees.

Mr. Rudko's work has included the administration of psychological tests, assisting psychologists in making specialized observations of group activities, conducting interviews, writing comprehensive reports (in English) of interviews and observations, interpreting and translating written test materials.

The research of the Labor Assessment project has now been completed except for a few follow-up studies. On or about 1 July the last of the US personnel will have returned to the U.S. and Mr. Rudko will be available for other employment.
