OPERATIONAL MATTERS AND COMMENTS:

SUBJECT: RV with Mykhaylo RUDKO on 25 June 1958 (Contact Report #5)

1. Agent reported he spent a number of days over the weekend of 22 June 1958 at Camp Valka in Muernberg in line with his routine business and attempt to obtain data on HOYZAKOVA discussed earlier with [redacted]

A. He reported he had several talks with Olga HOYZAKOVA nee PEREWICHKA (transliteration from the Ukrainian) (see earlier Contact Reports). In his preliminary assessment, agent felt HOYZAKOVA is clean of any intelligence involvement. He compared her with Gszalawa MIKITA and said the two women were completely different in temperament, interests, etc. He consented to write a detailed report on his interview with HOYZAKOVA.

B. In Muernberg, Agent chanced to meet Mykhaylo PROTSAILO (born 14 June 1929 in Lvov, Oblast) and Volodymyr KOZAK (born 1 August 1908 in Galicia Palant) who now live at Lager Zirndorf, Rothenburgstrasse 29 bei Muernberg. He introduced himself to them when he heard them speak Ukrainian. Subsequently, agent spent about six hours listening to their stories. Agent's assessment of them is that their stories appear to be fantastic and that probably they were dispatched to the West by the RIS. Agent asked if the AIS had any objections to his fulfilling PROTSAILO's request to obtain exact addresses of Ivan (Fedorovich) BOGAK (born 1900, Mokrotin, Ukraine), who left Europe for Toronto, Canada, in 1933, and Hryhorii HEVAK (Grigoriy GEVAK) (born 1925, Mokrotin, Ukraine), former UPA member who also lives in Toronto. (Note: These two names appear in KUBARK debriefings of PROTSAILO; see HQA-97586, 11 March 1958, Attachment B). Agent was told to follow his normal routine regarding PROTSAILO's request and that the two men would be checked against AIS files. Among other items, PROTSAILO said he has been corresponding with "SAHAYDACHNYIY" (an OUN alias) in the United States. He also mentioned he and KOZAK have had interviews with the BANDERAites, who appear to have taken a negative attitude toward them, and that [redacted] interviewed them in Muernberg sometime in May 1958.

2. Agent's ordinary work in Valka during this trip included giving assistance to Bela CAHALA and Susanna HORBECKA, Slovaks who came out of the CSB circa 1952. Agent's informal representative at Camp Valka is VIKTOR WIKACHENKO, an East Ukrainian. Agent volunteered he has good rapport with firm KRUEDEL, Lagerleiter at Camp Valka and Zirndorf, and thereby has free access to the camp's files, personnel, etc., and offered this source at the disposal of the AIS.

3. The balance of the contact was devoted to a discussion of various emigre and non-emigre topics as a measure of assessment. Comments will be reserved for an overall assessment of the agent.
