SUBJECT: Matters discussed with Mykhaylo HUDKO on 30 October 1958

Contact Report #13

1. HUDKO said he received another letter from Konstantin KAPUSTINSKY, now at Valka, who again requested a loan from HUDKO to help finance publication of a book KAPUSTINSKY has written. HUDKO said he has not yet replied and in order to maintain contact with KAPUSTINSKY he will discuss the matter further with him.

2. HUDKO's office received a letter from the Polish aid group on Bayerstrasse 13 in which the latter group requested information on [] [] appealed to the group for assistance in emigrating to Australia and on 8 October 1958 he changed his mind and said he wanted to go to Canada. He added that in about August 1958 he married a Polish emigre woman (na) and that he suspected her of having contacts with either the UB or HIS. [] volunteered to the Polish aid group that he was dispatched to West Germany in 1955 by the UB and that he told his full story to American authorities in Frankfurt (CAREZONE). [] USEP record indicates that after his release from CAREZONE he was employed during September 1956 - February 1958 as a cook with the U.S. Army and that since February 1958 he has been employed as a metal worker with a firm in Solingen-Ohlige, Weyerstrasse 141. [] eligibility for USEP assistance was turned down about April 1957; he claims he does not know the reasons for the turndown.
