Subject: Second Supplement to the Report on "Hiag"

1. Personnel

The following persons were elected at the 2nd Regular General Meeting (Hauptversammlung) of the Hiag Bund Liaison Office in Kassel on 7 and 8 November 1953:

- Dr. Guenther REINECKE, Munich, has not yet accepted the appointment to the position of legal advisor.

In addition, GOENKE, Bremen, was appointed case officer for prisoners-of-war still detained in the East.

2. Statutes

The draft of the statutes was discussed at the same meeting. A committee, appointed previously, submitted numerous suggestions for amendments, the most important ones being:

- (1) cultivation of the desire for military preparedness should be dropped;
- (2) individual membership in the Bund Liaison Office should be discontinued;
- (3) only Land associations or independent Kreis or local associations should be allowed to become members of the Bund Liaison Office;
- (4) the rights of the Presidium should be amended to the effect that a decision can be retracted only by the majority of those members of the Presidium who are present at the respective meeting;
- (5) the right to vote in the Bund Meeting (Bundversammlung) should be so amended that each Land Speaker has one vote for every 200 members, or a fraction of that number, out at least five votes. The required number should be determined on the basis of the list of contributions;
- (6) individual Hiag members should be admitted to the Board of Chairmen for special assignments and for a limited period of time, if the respective local Land association has no objections;
- (7) president of the Board of Chairmen should be the "Bundesgeschaeftsfuehrer" (Gen. Managing Director);
- (8) the Presidium should be elected by the Board of Chairmen. The Presidium should assist the Board of Chairmen with its advice. Public statements of basic importance should require previous agreement with the Board of Chairmen;
- (9) instead of Land associations not yet officially registered, seven Land Speakers should be admitted to the Bund Liaison Office as

individual members until this problem is definitely solved. These amendments were unequivocally accepted by the Land Speakers. According to RICHARD, there are now 13 Land associations embracing 241 local Hlags.

Land Association Hesse has been divided into Land Association North Hesse (KURTZ) (6) and South Hesse (GENTSCH) (7).

Land Association Bavaria has also been divided into Land Association North Bavaria (DENNE) (8) and South Bavaria (RUOFF) (9).

The official title bestowed upon RICHARD is "Bundessprecher" (Bund Speaker).

It was decided to adopt regulations concerning amicable arrangement and arbitration. Occasional problems should be solved on local level. If this is not possible, the Land Association will give judgment. It will be the duty of the Bund Liaison Office to give expert opinions in matters of basic importance.

3. Internal discussions on political aims

- a. An internal meeting took place in Eschwege, restaurant Prinzenpark, on 30 October and 1 November 1953. The participants, who numbered approximately forty, were specially selected by the Land Speaker in concordance with RICHARD, and invitations were extended only orally. It was forbidden to make notes in writing. (List of participants, Annex 1). The purpose of the meeting was to acquaint a large group of reliable young members with the political missions of the functionaries of the Bund Liaison Office. To that end, a memorandum was read which had been composed by STEINER. It said that although the Hlags were free from party policies and wished to remain so, nobody should blame them, if they, like other communities of interest, trade unions, employers' associations etc., should enter upon political activities, sending persons to the platform who were capable of standing up for the economic and ethical demands of the Hlag, and to make them heard, if only in legislature.

In the course of the discussion, it was discussed to get together with political parties in order to place an adequate number of trusted Hlag members on the lists of nominees; in return Hlag would promise its vote.

The rest of the discussion did not have the success desired by the initiators. Many participants protested against tainting Hlag activities with politics. It was criticized that the management on federal level often engaged in activities which were none of their business, and without being authorized by the members. The argument that the existence of the organization was jeopardized, and that many members would resign, induced DENNE to admit frankly that the initiators of this meeting were of the same opinion, and that, therefore, they wished to acquaint the audience with the outlined ideas so that they could use their influence over lower echelons.

No resolution was adopted, since it was not possible to deflect the audience.

- b. Before the Second Regular Bund Meeting was opened on 7 and 8 November 1953 in Hotel "Neue Drusel" in Kassel, HAUSSER invited the Management Board of the Bund Liaison Office, the Land Speakers and STEINER to an internal conversation which lasted 1½ hours.

HAUSSER read a memorandum concerning the matter of the Bund Liaison Office, which contained the following points:

- (1) the connection between Land associations must continue to be merely a loose one;
- (2) a solid organization is not desirable;
- (3) three men must be appointed to form a Coordination Committee, whose speaker is the Managing Director;
- (4) it is risky to establish the Bund Liaison Office as a registered association;
- (5) the presidium should be replaced by a Council of Elders which has only advisory capacity but no authority;
- (6) strictly reserved attitude in public;
- (7) cooperation with "VdS", with the final object of a fusion.

The discussion following the reading was very agitated. No compromise was reached to unite the diverging opinions. STEINER, especially, protested most harshly against HAUSSER's proposals.

HAUSSER's motion was not placed on the agenda when organization and statutes were discussed. HAUSSEH declared that he felt he could no longer help carrying the responsibility for the development of the Bund Association of the Hieg. He left the meeting.

RICHARD stated in the course of the meeting, that all efforts which were going to be made would have bearing on the Death Head associations as well as on the reserve troops.

4. Internal events

RICHARD announced at the Second Regular Bund Meeting that he and STEINER would soon visit eight German major firms and ask them for financial help for returned POWs.

Invited before an Investigating Committee of the Regular Meeting, GILLER retracted his accusations against RICHARD concerning the latter's alleged relations in the East with FRANK-GRIEKSCHE, and expressed his regret. Both parties agreed that this apology should not be made in front of the entire audience. At the meeting it was merely announced that all accusations in this respect had proven to be unfounded.

Several Working Committees were appointed to deal with the considerable amount of work, and each Land association sent a delegate to each of them. The following committees were established:

- A. Committee for Organization and Statutes (Main Committee), Chairman HANDEL, Northrhine-Westphalia;

civic rights of the former European and Ethnic German volunteers, and possibilities for granting them German citizenship;

legal situation in view of the Huernberg sentences;

examination of the possibility of a complaint instituted on the basis of the Constitution, or, respectively, an action for obtaining a declaratory judgment concerning the civic equality of soldiers of the former Waffen-SS.

C. Committee for persons sentenced in consequence of war events, for prisoners-of-war, and for welfare activities (Chairman Dietrich ZIMMSEN, Brackenheim)

Accusation of corruption raised against GILLE
situation of "Wiking-Ruf"

a. History

Upon GILLE's suggestion, a circular letter was sent out at the beginning of 1952, which bore already the name "Wiking-Ruf" because it was mainly meant for former members of the SS-Division "Wiking" of which GILLE had at one time been the chief. Afterwards, a wealthy former SS-member by the name of BLEIBAUM, Hameln, financed an information bulletin of the same name which was combined with a book sale. Then BLEIBAUM did the bookselling for his own account, since it appeared to be profitable. Upon GILLE's suggestion, BLEIBAUM received his share, and a company was set up consisting of GILLE and the editors KAMIS and SEHAUS who had in the meantime joined the paper as full-time staff members. It has already been reported that GILLE held 51%, while the other two held 49% between them.

Then BLEIBAUM was paid, GILLE retained 700 DM on the grounds that BLEIBAUM owed him that sum. BLEIBAUM sued him, and GILLE was ordered to pay the money.

b. Soz. since April 1952

After the company had been established, the paper soured and made profits to the displeasure of the High members, because the profits were not spent on social needs. However, the financial situation remained in the dark because GILLE refused to render an account for the time prior to the establishment of the company. As has been reported before, the Land Speakers decided on 20 September 1953 to look into the business dealings of "Wiking-Ruf", and commissioned former chief of the SS-School for Administrative Leaders THOELE (10) to do so.

c. GILLE's drawings

Shortly afterwards GILLE bought an Opel-Olympia car for 4,000 DM; he borrowed 3,000 DM from a bank, and took 1,500 DM out of the money drawer of the "Wiking-Ruf", without informing his partner.

THOELE (10) found out that prior to the establishment of the company GILLE had taken from "Wiking-Ruf" at least 5,000 DM, but

probably about 8.00 DM.

d. KANIS' drawings

KANIS took 800 DM from the money drawer in order to travel, in the company of RICHARD, to Bamberg and Bonn to attend Search Service meetings. When GILLE reproached him for it, he turned to FRICKE (11), who in turn sent him on to Graf von WESTARP. Von WESTARP, together with FRICKE and KANIS, saw a certain DIEHLS (12) in Hannover, who immediately declared to be willing to grant a loan of 800 DM.

e. Conversion

In view of GILLE's behavior and of the annoyance of the Land Speakers, KANIS and SEEHAUS told the Bund Liaison Office that they would hand over their shares to the organization as such, and that they suggested to turn the publishing house into a non-profit company. GILLE refused to agree to this proposal.

f. Liquidation

The Press Committee, which met on 8 November 1953, presided over by H. SCHUETZ, chief of the Plesse Publishing House in Goettingen, recommended to the Regular Bund Meeting on federal level to liquidate the King Publishing House as of 30 November or 31 December 1953. GILLE, KANIS and SEEHAUS promised to transfer the name "Wiking-Ruf", without charge, to the Bund Liaison Office. GILLE was supposed to receive 300 DM per month for two years; KANIS and SEEHAUS were to be employed against a gross salary of 475 DM. The Bund Liaison Office promised not to open a book service as a competition for GILLE, and granted him space for advertisements in "Wiking-Ruf". The Regular Bund Meeting decided that the final decisions concerning the transfer of the periodical will be made by a committee.

5. Finances

The Regular Bund Meeting decided to pay 10 Pfennig per month per member to the Bund Liaison Office. RICHARD stated that the Bund Liaison Office has received only RM 510 so far from the Land associations.

Votes concerning the problems of burial and accident insurances will be collected in writing after the situation has been clarified.

6. Connections

At the Second Regular Bund Meeting, all Land associations complained about lack of cooperation with "Vds/BVW". They strictly refuse cooperative fusion. RICHARD recommended to combine "BVS" with "Arbeitsgemeinschaft soldatischer Verbände" (Working Community of Associations of Soldiers).

Executive Committee

Dr. Wolk, the "Commissioner for Legal Affairs" in the Bundesverbindungsstelle (BVS) mentioned in the 2nd Supplementary report, is identical with the Lawyer and Notary Dr. Ralf WEHSE (1).

Dissatisfaction among the members of the Executive Committee and among the membership about the fact that the press is paying little attention to the Hieg, has induced the leading functionaries to appoint a "Commissioner for Press Affairs" to the Bund Executive Committee. He is supposed to edit the official Hieg press items, to evaluate press articles, and to issue information bulletins on for local and "Landes-sprecher". This plan has not been carried out for lack of a suitable person. If the plan should be successful, BVS will become the central point of influence for the various independent information bulletin and "Kameradenbriefe" of local Hiegs; such central point is non-existent at present.

Membership

The total number of Hieg members can hardly be higher than approximately 20,000, although according to propagandistic statements made by functionaries there are supposed to be 40,000.

Organization

The distribution list mentioned in circular letters of the BVS (for instance in one dated 28 November 1953) named 240 local Hieg-Committees (Kreis and local associations) and 14 Land associations. In regard to the first figure it must be considered that some local associations are organized so as to form Kreis associations. Apparently they include local Hiegs which are in the process of being established. Some 200 local Hiegs are in a workable state.

Full-time members of the BVS are four gentlemen, in addition to RICHARD JORDACK (2), FRIEDRICH (3), FRIEDRICH (4), Kurt KILB (5), and four female clerks.

Propagandistic statements

MICHAEL (6), while talking to Graf WESFAL (on 20 December 1953 in Hannover), stressed once more that it is necessary to give the Hieg members a "national political education" and to provide them with "political guides". He announced that a special information bulletin for "suitable sub-leaders" will be issued which will be devoted to this educational purpose. It will be printed in 500-600 copies; a start has not yet been made.

Internal meetings

The Bund Congress planned for Whitoun 1954 is not going to take place, nor the Bund Meeting planned for Spring 1954. The reason stated in both cases is that the BVS is overloaded with "work concerned with the restoration of our equal rights". In August 1954 the BVS will be newly elected according to the stipulations of the statutes.

The BVS will delegate speakers for the scheduled monthly meetings of local and Kreis Communities; these speakers will be trained in May and June 1954 in three BVS courses.

Publications

"Wiking-Ruf" is a "Kommanditgesellschaft" (Limited Partnership). The partners are SCHUBERT, RICHARD, Dr. WFBELM; general partner is STADLER (7); managing director is SCHUBERT. The partners have signed a declaration stating that they have no rights in "Wiking-Ruf".

The address of the editors of "Wiking-Ruf" is: Hameln, Muehlenstr. 10 A. Editor-in-chief is KANIS, his deputy is SEFMAUS; there is the assistant Frau HO. FRANK (8), a secretary, and an errand-boy.

Finances

According to a decision of the BVS in Kassel on 7/8 November 1953 each member will pay a monthly contribution of DM 1.- to the local Hlag. The latter pays DM 0.20 per month per member to the Land association; the latter, in turn, pays DM 0.10 per month per member to the BVS. The BVS complains about meager receipts of contributions from Land associations (between DM 160.- and DM 200.- per month at present).

BURACK (Berlin) stated that a "group of sponsors" has been found which will pay regular contributions to BVS. It has not yet been possible to ascertain any names.

Connections

In a letter dated 2 February 1954 addressed to BAUKANN (9), who is in charge of the liaison for the Wallonian and French ex-SS-members, RICHARD demanded that there should be no organizational contact with associations of former SS-members in foreign countries, because the impression thus created of an international merger of SS-communities would not but constitute a political danger to Hlag interests. This is in contradiction to RICHARD's formerly voiced standpoint that international Hlag connections should be promoted. Perhaps it is his intention to establish such connections himself.

Jean BEMMELER (10), who is in charge of the French section consisting of ex-members of the SS-Division "Charlemagne" is a follower of Maurice BARDECI. It is said that he is an adventurer, who is still under the influence of Nazi ideas and of the thought of revenge.

Since May 1953 a local interest in establishing youth organizations has been observed. For instance, the group "Deutsche Zugvogel" (German Birds of Passage) consists of 60 boys and girls. This group is chiefly engaged in hiking, open-air games, and ancient dances. No political lectures have as yet been held; it has been announced, however, that such lectures are going to be held soon.

BVS has requested all local and Kreis communities and all Land associations to keep in touch on a basis of comradeship, to cooperate closely,

and to organize meetings together with the "Bund ehemaliger deutscher Fallschirmjäger" (League of former German Parachutists).

No union is intended with VdS (League of German Soldiers) neither on Land level nor locally. Friendly relations are desirable. This statement, which was made by RICHARD at the meeting of the Land association Schleswig-Holstein (in Kiel on 28 November 1953) is in contradiction to the statement made by DEBEC (11) (Cologne) who announced his intention to combine Hing Cologne with VdS.

At the Land meeting of delegates in Hamburg (2 December 1954) RICHARD rejected an approach to radical groups (DnP and similar groups), but advocated cooperation with the right FDP wing under Martin WULF.

Evaluation

The group of young functionaries around Bundesaprecher RICHARD has succeeded in eliminating most of the influence exercised over the organization by the older generals STÄHNKE and GILL. The management is almost completely in the hands of RICHARD who is supported by a number of Landesaprecher appointed by him.

Time and again RICHARD and his friends leave the moderate line of HENJESSE who is opposed to the centralization of the organization and against the political activities of the Hing.

- (a) The plans described above concerning training material and training courses are characteristic for the progress of the centralization of the organization, and for the influence reaching from top to bottom which is connected with it. This tendency is also marked by the improvement of the organization of Land associations whose staffs of functionaries have in the course of this month been modeled after the setup of the Bund Executive Committee.
- (b) RICHARD thinks that it is necessary to go in for politics, by which he means:
 - (1) exerting influence over the legislature of the Federal Republic in favor of the ex-members of the Waffen-SS;
 - (2) publication of the opinions of ex-members of the Waffen-SS in regard to military problems in connection with the planned remilitarization;
 - (3) publication of Hing's opinion in regard to general political problems.

The ostensible attitude of prominent Hing functionaries toward the democratic constitution is at present pronouncedly loyal but cool. Internally, rejection is often clearly apparent, and is sharply voiced in lower echelons of functionaries.
