Then the ex-police officers were told by the Nationalist League that in the event of a communist inspired coup d'etat, they would be placed back in their former positions dependent upon time served in state service. It was not promised, however, that they would again receive executive duties, that was to be decided in the future. In this report it can be stated, through the circles that have access to factual information and many sources, that the ex-criminal prosecutor of the Gestapo, Johann SANITZER is soon expected in Vienna. He is now working in Berlin, or in the East zone of Germany; and is the head of a school for East Germany secret services. It was further discovered that Sanitzer was approached by the American intelligence service during his arrest in L. G. Vienna, in order to win him over. He agreed to work but insisted on the condition that his activities would not be against Austrian citizens; the American IS did not make this concession, forcing Sanitzer to decline. Further information has shown that a proposal to send a number of the ex-police officials to school in Germany has not met with success. It has been up to now impossible, even with the most thorough official inquiry, not possible to discover the names of the ex-police officials. Finally, it was necessary to approach one of the ex-police officials and to use bribery in order to gain his confidence.

In summary it can be stated, since all facts bend in this direction, that Oster is working for the pro-communist intelligence service of the Nationalist League. He, on the surface, seemingly earns his livelihood through his wife's Coffee house, which in fact is frequented only moderately. Nevertheless he is supposed to possess wealth which is out of proportion to his actual income. His true occupation are different business activities than his wife's Coffee house.

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
