1. KOZAK, Vilam, born 20 April 1911 in Pohrebicka, CSR; KK #291 957, 28 August 1950, Nurnberg; resid. Nurnberg, Camp Valka, Barracks I-A-3 (October, 1952), previously Straubing. Professional soldier; married. Physical Description: 5'7" (170 cm.) tall, weight 135-140 lbs. (60-64 kg.), dark brown hair, gray eyes. He attended schools in Mala Skala/Vranove, Turnov, and Ceska Lipa, CSR. He was drafted into Czech Army in 1933; graduated from Czech Military Academy with rank of Reg. Lt. in 1938. During World War II he served in OBZ (Department of Security Intelligence) until imprisoned in 1949. He was a member of the Czech Communist Party from 1945 to 1949. He was released in 1950; re-arrested and escaped, crossing into Germany 20 July 1950. He arrived at Camp Valka 3 August 1950. For a while he worked for a Labor Service Co., but was discharged because of his former Communist affiliations. In October, 1952, his name and personalia were circulated as "undesirable for future use in any field of intelligence," he having been dismissed with prejudice for ineptitude, failure to report his activities and breach of trust.

a. KOZAK, fnu. Ex-staff Capt.; Nurnberg, Camp Valka, Barracks A; served in Czech Army; was faithful party-line Communist; he is said to have been chief of Labor Branch Office of Czech Intelligence for the Prachatitz area. He came to Germany from CSR end August, 1950. According to a report of October, 1950, he had gone to the Swiss border twice in the last month, allegedly to meet his fiancée, who wanted to bring him into Switzerland; visa application was submitted to Nurnberg passport office.

b. KOZAK, fnu. Ex-Czech staff Capt., resid. Nurnberg. A name trace query was submitted 5 May 1954 by a field base concerned with the security of one of its operatives. It reported that KOZAK deserted to Germany a few years ago and that he is an agent of LFV Nurnberg.

c. KOZAK, Wilhelm. Ex-Czech officer, emigrated from CSR 15 July 1950; now in Camp Valka; unemployed. 170 cm. (5'7") tall, slender, brown eyes. In June, 1954, working for a field base.

NOTE: Paragraphs 1.a., 1.b. and 1.c. are all believed to be identical with paragraph 1.

2. KOSAK, Vaclav, born 25 July 1903, architect in Munich, ex-IRO employee. Dropped by a field base March, 1949; on HUCOM dropped agents list 25 September 1951. In 1950 Czech emigre rumors that he is a Czech agent.

3. KOSSAK, Vaclav, ex-1st Lt. Polish ANDERS Army; came from Paris in 1948 to Munich, where allegedly visited by French Intelligence (Same Bur).

NOTE: It appears that paragraph 3 may be identical with paragraph 2.

4. KOZAK, Wladimir or Wolodymyr: former company commander, 29th Regt., 14th Ukrainian SS Div.; resid. vicinity Moosach, but not in the camp; works with Ukrainian Committee, Munich, Dachauerstr. 9/II; said to be member of a German officers' society. Wolodymyr KOZAK reported as an SB member (December, 1952).
