SUBJECT: AECAPLIN discussion with Colonel Heinz SCHMALSCHLAGER

REPORT DATE: 8 March 1956

1. SCHMALSCHLAGER telephoned me at 0900 hours of 7 March 1956, stating that he had returned to Munich and invited me to a cup of coffee. We met at 1100 hours for one hour at Cafe Kustermann, on Herzog-Heinrichstrasse, Munich-Schwabing.
2. He stated that, during the past two weeks, he traveled throughout Germany conversing with various groups of people to sound them out concerning the approaching elections in Germany. As he stated, he wanted to determine the "election climate". Generally, he found that German citizens are beginning to lose faith in its political parties. The split in the Bonn coalition, the creation of blocks against the coalition has disoriented Germans to the point that they will not vote for any party. Some say, "We voted for FDP because they would carry out their politics against the Social-Democrats and would take a position against the coalition. The Social-Democrats are criticizing their party because it has taken a position with various elements of the coalition, with FDP capitalists and other right-wing elements, etc." All parties criticize the Adenauer's politics, denouncing his dictatorial tactics and his fawning before Western powers. SCHMALSCHLAGER stated that many political centers will be amazed at the outcome of the elections.
3. He criticized especially the German bureaucratism, stating that many people hold posts in which they are not competent, blaming other for mistakes, scandals, etc.
4. While in Bonn, he spoke with the state attorney who was in charge of the Boris LEVITSKY affair. The attorney stated that SPD was taking every possible step to free LEVITSKY, that the British were very interested in this affair. The attorney stated further that he had evidence to present in the case but cannot predict the outcome of the case but felt that LEVITSKY would be found guilty.
5. SCHMALSCHLAGER stated that his belief that Vladimir PERELSKY, on whom the German IS has collected a batch of incriminating information, will find himself in a position of accountability. Perhaps less in his case than in the instance of his wife, Maria BLAZHKOVITSKA-PERELSKA. Just as LEVITSKY, PERELSKY enjoys the confidence of Professor Gerhard von HEINDE.
6. Toward the conclusion of our discussion, SCHMALSCHLAGER stated that he received very interesting information about church life in the CSR from a returnee from the CSR. He will provide me with a copy of this material for observation since they undoubtedly would be of interest to me.

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
