1. The BfV has now confirmed that the double agent lives in Hasburg. He is a Sudeten German and has a sister living in Prague who is married to a Czech. The sister once visited the agent some time ago. She later wrote to him stating that she had possibilities for traveling to Berlin, which she does rather frequently. She claimed that her travel to Berlin was facilitated by the fact that she was having an "affair" with the Czech ambassador in East Berlin, to whom she refers as "Jaro." (A check of the DDR Protocol List dated July 1958, shows only a Jaroslav TUNICHT, commercial counselor, and a Jaroslav VOJTESCH, 1st Secretary.)

2. The BfV doubts very much if the sister is really the mistress of the Czech ambassador. She claims that her travel to Berlin is arranged through diplomatic channels, but the BfV doubts this very much, but rather, thinks it more likely that it is arranged through intelligence channels. The BfV suspects it is more likely that she is the mistress of EICHMANN himself (probably a cover name). She introduced her brother to EICHMANN who subsequently recruited him. The reason the BfV suspects that she is the mistress of EICHMANN is that she is always with EICHMANN when the double agent goes to his Berlin meetings. There seems to be a close relationship between EICHMANN and the sister. She claimed that on Rosenmontag she and EICHMANN went to West Berlin where they visited a judge (identity unknown).

3. If all of the foregoing is true, this case then offers possibilities for affecting contact with a Czech intelligence officer. The BfV added, however, that the double agent is somewhat of a handling problem. He tends to be impulsive and take things in his own hands. He operated as an agent for a time before confessing to the BfV. At that time he also had told the Czechs that he had a chance to enlist in the Bundeswehr as a radio operator. Of course, it was purely a figment of his imagination and now he is having trouble trying to explain to the Czechs why he can't get in the Bundeswehr.

4. We plan to pass the Reference F photos to the BfV for showing to the agent as soon as we receive the photos promised in BRIN 3008. In view of Reference D and paragraph 1 above, we see the possibility that Frau EICHMANN is identical with Jaroslav ANTOB. We will keep addressees advised of further developments in this case.
