1. **SUMMARY:** The following is an outline of UPHILL's activities in connection with their Fall MONOGRAM since Reference. All of our reports on this case have been received from @KUTZBACH during informal discussions, and none of the following was received in writing. Since @KUTZBACH is prone upon occasion to exaggerate or embellish details on a case, we cannot vouch for the accuracy of all of the material reported. Hans SCHOEDEL (GRAM) continues to meet regularly with his Czech case officers in East Berlin, to receive allegedly unimportant EEI's which appear to be more in the nature of test missions, and to collect his salary from both the Czechs and UPHILL.

2. On 27 August 1960 GRAM flew to West Berlin and somewhat surprisingly was again met by EICHMANN (ANTOS) in East Berlin, although we had suspected that ANTOS had turned GRAM over to another case officer. At the meeting he was given EEI's to gather information on various individuals in West Germany. After the meeting was over, ANTOS drove Subject back into the West Sector but did not take him all the way to the airport. Following the meeting, UPHILL was still somewhat at a loss to explain the lack of detailed and worthwhile missions assigned to Subject by the Czech IS. They therefore surveilled Subject for an undetermined period in Hamburg and he made an unexplained trip to a cemetery where he rummaged about behind one of the gravestones. When the UPHILL handling officer later questioned GRAM about his activities, he denied even having visited the graveyard in question. UPHILL is becoming even more dubious about Subject's honesty and the extent to which he is cooperating with them.

3. The next meeting between GRAM and his Czech case officer occurred circa 8 October 1960. (Meetings occur regularly approximately every six weeks and almost always on a Saturday. The agent flies to West Berlin and then travels by subway to East Berlin and is met in front of the Hotel Adria. He is then normally driven to a meeting place, which is sometimes the apartment on Pfeilstrasse (ANTOS' apartment?) or to a restaurant.) ANTOS and fnu NOVOTNY were present at the meeting. GRAM described fnu NOVOTNY as born circa 1928, circa 187 cm tall, strong athletic figure, medium blond hair parted on the left side, grey blue eyes, small mouth and chin, and wide forehead. He wears a sports watch and a gold ring with a red-brown stone, on his left ring finger. UPHILL files contain a report that one Pavel NOVOTNY resides on Pfeilstrasse, and we would appreciate BOB's comments as to whether or not "fnu NOVOTNY" might be identical with Pavel. On UPHILL's instructions, GRAM noted that increased restrictions on travel to East Berlin and the problems he might encounter were he to continue to travel to Berlin. ANTOS said that if it were not possible for their meetings to take place in East Berlin, they could probably meet in Switzerland or Austria. (COMMENT: It would seem highly unlikely that ANTOS would actually travel to Switzerland for a meeting in view of his previous adventures there.) During our discussions with @KUTZBACH following this meeting we again asked about EEI's assigned to GRAM, and received a more or less non-committal reply. @KUTZBACH did mention Wolfgang Heinz KLOSE born 27 February 1920 in Leipzig as one of the EEI's given to Subject by the CIS. KLOSE is married and resides in Berlin-Friedenau, Wendlandseele 12/IV. He is an Amtsgerichtsrat, and as of February 1960 he was handling civil cases. KLOSE is a cousin of the first husband of KOTLAROVA aka GOTTLAROVA who is GRAM's sister. On one occasion - apparently at the meeting of circa 8 October 1960 - "ANTOS" allegedly remarked that KLOSE visited Prague and saw GOTTLAROVA. At this meeting ANTOS promised GRAM that his sister GOTTLAROVA would be in Berlin and present when they next met.

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4. The next meeting between GRAM and his Czech case officer took place on 26 November 1960 in East Berlin. NOVOTNY picked Subject up in front of the Adria Hotel and drove him to a restaurant. @KUTZBACH could not recall whether the name of the restaurant was Cafe Budapest or Cafe Warsaw. ANTOS was waiting at the restaurant when NOVOTNY and GRAM arrived, and GRAM immediately asked about the whereabouts of his sister GOTTLAROVA. ANTOS disappeared briefly and returned with GOTTLAROVA in tow. While ANTOS and NOVOTNY were talking in Czech, GRAM carried on a conversation with his sister in German. During the discussion GRAM told his sister that he was aware that KLOSE had visited her in Czechoslovakia for a two week period and GOTTLAROVA was amazed to learn that GRAM was aware of this visit. GOTTLAROVA indicated to her brother that she wanted to leave Czechoslovakia and emigrate to the Federal Republic together with her husband and son, and UPHILL suspects that the Czech IS may be using GRAM in an attempt to infiltrate a resident agent into the FedRep. Somewhat amazingly, GOTTLAROVA gave GRAM photographs of herself, husband and son, so that he would have them in his possession should it be necessary for him to help her get permission to travel to the Federal Republic. During GRAM's discussions with his sister he learned that while in Prague, KLOSE and GOTTLAROVA had visited various spots around Prague including Lidice and the Bohemian Forest. She allegedly was going to visit KLOSE (in West Berlin) during the next few days while staying in East Berlin. When asked about the EEI's the agent was given at this meeting, @KUTZBACH only commented that they still appeared of little value and not of sufficient interest to warrant Czech intelligence expenditure of time and money. Before the close of the meeting, GRAM received instructions to make the next meeting in Zurich on 7 January 1961 with an individual whom he had not seen before. He was given contact instructions, and was supposed to pass his reports to the contact and in return receive 700 DM's and new EEI's. The 700 DM's would cover the cost of his travel to Zurich and be payment for the period of 26 November to 7 January. The meeting in Zurich was to be of a very short duration, and only long enough for the agent to receive the sealed envelope from the Czech courier. The subsequent meeting was scheduled for East Berlin (circa 25 February), and this is somewhat illogical since GRAM had insisted on the meeting in Zurich on the basis that travel to West Berlin and from there to East Berlin was insecure.

5. The meeting in Zurich was surveilled by two UPHILLers without GRAM's knowledge, and took place as scheduled. UPHILL will pass us copies of the photographs of the Czech agent taken by the UPHILL surveillants so that we may attempt to identify the Czech involved. Although GRAM turned in two envelopes to his UPHILL case officer, the two individuals surveilling the meeting observed the Czech agent passing GRAM several envelopes, "a stack of envelopes" was the way @KUTZBACH described it.

6. UPHILL's @KUTZBACH is proceeding with customary caution, and is loath to take any action in the case. He apparently prefers to sit back and watch the contradictory events transpire, while gently massaging the mass of paper which accumulates in the file. He has considered placing CALLIKAN coverage on Wolfgang KLOSE (in Berlin), but doesn't want to take this step until he receives the results of the BDC check and determines whether there is anything to prohibit an official of the courts from traveling to Czechoslovakia. KLOSE was processed as a refugee from East Germany in 1953 and received recognition as a political refugee in 1956, another reason for not traveling to Czechoslovakia. In obtaining political recognition, KLOSE claimed that he attended the Free University in West Berlin and while he was attending the University the MFS visited his mother in East Germany and claimed that he wasn't registered. This frightened KLOSE and he allegedly decided to flee to the West.

7. COMMENT: Both UPHILL and we are somewhat surprised at the lack of sensible EEI's, and UPHILL suspects that GRAM may be playing both ends against the middle by supplying the Czechs with certain information of which he does not inform UPHILL. It is also somewhat amazing that GRAM allegedly has no means of communication to the Czechs, and if he would have to cancel a meeting or wish a special meeting he would have no means for arranging same. @KUTZBACH

and UPHILL have no reason to coordinate with us on Fall MONOGRAM in greater detail, so that we must rely on the informal discussions held with @KUTZEACH for the very sketchy outline presented above. We doubt if a detailed report would do more than to raise further doubts in our mind as to the advisability of running the case in this manner, or of running it at all.

8. BERLIN: It would be appreciated if you would comment on the NOVOTNY noted in para. 3, and any additional information or identifying data you can provide on Pavel NOVOTNY. Our files indicate that he may be identical with Doctor Pavel NOVOTNY mentioned in EGMA-45810 dated 8 November 1927 and EGMA-30810 dated 23 December 1957.

BOB suggests Robert THER rather than Pavel NOVOTNY who is no longer in Berlin.
