1. We have developed the following items of information pertinent to UPHILL's Fall MONOGRAM since date of Reference:

a. It is confirmed that Jaroslav ANTOS [ ] , whose continued presence at the Czech Embassy has been reported only by that questionable source, Alias GRAM, is still in East Berlin. We are in receipt of a 16 June 1961 intercept of a telephone conversation in which Marie MUELLEROVA, calling from her apartment, advised her husband, Adolf MUELLER [ ] , at the Czech Military Mission, that "Jarda dropped in". MUELLER asked which one, and she answered, "ANTOS." MUELLER then asked if Honza (CMM Consul, Jan FUCHS -- [ ] ) had arrived yet for lunch. MUELLEROVA said that he had not. MUELLER told his wife that he would be right home. It is interesting that ANTOS, MUELLER and FUCHS were meeting at MUELLER's apartment. We hesitate to comment on the significance of FUCHS' presence as he was regularly invited out to lunch and dinner during this period because his wife was in Czechoslovakia.

b. We have received one additional mail intercept addressed to Wolfgang KLOSE. This is a letter written by one Kazimierz BISEWSKI, Abrahama 12/8, Wladyslawowo, Poland (no BOB traces) to KLOSE, a fellow-philatelist, advising KLOSE that the former has received official permission to send postage stamps abroad. The letter discusses this matter.

c. Further investigation of KLOSE's neighbors indicates that there is only one in whom there is ODYOKE interest. This is a widow,
