<p>Reference: A. EGMA-65781, 31 December 1964 B. [] [] 21 March 1965</p> <p>1. Returned under separate cover are the photos forwarded to [] [] with Reference A. We have not seen any of the persons depicted in connection with this case.</p> <p>2. As reported in Reference B the technical monitoring of the meeting was completely unsuccessful. The only result was monitoring of the Copenhagen taxi wave band, approaching aircraft etc. We regret the wasted opportunity, which was probably the last we will have in Copenhagen to monitor the case and get a look at GEIGE. We do not know the reason for the unsuccessful technical coverage. It could be that the transmitter (either [] [] or CATIDE's pepper mill) did not work and it could also be that our monitoring equipment simply could not pick up the transmitter on the frequency being used.</p> <p>3. The LENSKY/GEIGE meeting apparently took place as scheduled on 20 March but in compliance with MUNI-2253, 18 March 1965, we made no effort to surveil the meeting or the meeting place. We had invited [] [] to dinner in a restaurant with his wife on 20 March 1965 and while in the restaurant we saw [] [] having dinner with two male persons and a female. When [] [] waved to [] [] at our table the latter commented that [] [] must be having dinner with some CATIDERS who were now winding up the GEIGE case. We asked how the meeting had come off and [] [] replied that he knew only that the meeting had taken place as scheduled and that the CATIDERS were satis- fied with the results but that he had no additional details because he [] [] had just come back from a week in London and had not had time to be briefed on the details of the meeting. [] [] also said that he did not know [] [] companions and could only assume that they were CATIDERS that were either new in the case or some that had not been introduced to [] [] previously.</p> <p>4. During the dinner we had a good look at one of the alleged CATIDE officers and when we got home we prepared the attached IDENTIKIT photo. It gives a reasonable likeness of the man but his widow's peak is more pronounced and his temples are more bald. We would estimate that he is about 35-40 years old and appears to be a very suave type. His dark complexion makes us suspect that he is a Southern German and his tan makes us believe that he is an outdoor type. <p>photos that we are returning, although he could look like a much younger version of number 5. If Munich has some additional suspects whose pictures we could examine, we could probably pick out the right person.</p>		
<p>5. We are unable to describe the other male person at the table since he sat behind a wooden partition and we only got a brief look at him when we left the restaurant. He appeared to be about 60 years of age with a rather gaunt face.</p>		
<p>6. The female at the table would be [] wife [] has never seen [] (his wife) or she could be a CATIDE secretary or wife. She also sat behind the partition and we were therefore unable to get a good look at her.</p>		
<p>7. We have tried to contact [] in the hope that we could discreetly provoke him into saying something about his CATIDE friends but he is on a trip and will not return til about 29 March. When he is back in town we shall see what we can elicit from him.</p>		
<p>8. When [] has had a chance to be briefed on the meeting we shall try to elicit some details from him also. We may further be able to pick up some more from [] and [], although both these officers were out of town when the GEIGE meeting took place on 20 March.</p>
