Discussing the aftermath of the SCHOEBEL case KASTELL gave us the following tidbits:

a. Fnu KRAMELS, the officer providing countersurveillance for LENSKI was lost to the Danish surveillance team for two hours immediately after the arrest of LENSKI. He did not return to his office during that time. The Danes hoping to pick him up again had his office staked out. They presume, but have no evidence for their presumption, that he was, during that time, in touch with the RIS representative in Copenhagen because almost immediately following the arrest and for sometime thereafter there was considerable telephone traffic between the Czech and the Soviet Embassies. The Danes also presume that the Czechs are under instruction to report a flap of the LENSKI arrest type to the Soviets promptly.

b. The Danish Service has a complete film of the meeting and arrest. (We are not sure whether he referred here to [ ] or the [ ] but he referred to the Service of which a [ ] is Chief.) CATIDE expects to get a copy of the film.

c. The Bellevue Hotel, according to KASTELL actually belongs to the [ ], they can at random replace personnel there putting their own personnel in place of the regular employees. At the time of the LENSKI affair the doorman on duty in the lobby and one waiter were thus replaced.
