1. We have received the following additional items of information on the SCHOEBEL case:

a. (Jaroslav KRAML () who countersurveilled the LENSKY-SCHOEBEL meeting that resulted in the arrest of the latter two men, was lost to the () surveillance team for two hours immediately after the arrest took place. () staked out his office and noticed his return after two hours. They presume, although they have no evidence, that KRAML used the time to get in touch with the RIS representative in Copenhagen. () also presumes that the Czech Intelligence Service is under instructions to report flaps like the LENSKY arrest promptly to the Soviets. @KASTELL also discussed the same telephone conversation between the Soviet Embassy and the Czech Embassy that was mentioned in Reference B.

b. A complete film was made of the meeting and arrest and CATIDE expects to receive a copy of the film. We are not sure which service handled this but it was the one headed by Identity.

c. KASTELL said that the Bellevue Hotel where the meeting took place actually belongs to () and they are in a position to replace any hotel personnel with their own people any time they want. At the time of the LENSKY affair, the doorman on duty in the lobby and one waiter were thus replaced.
