1. Information Objectives: Unchanged (See Kapok B-164)
2. Specific Targets: Unchanged
3. Covert Personnel: CAMLET
4. Proposed method of control and contact: Unchanged
5. Proposed Cover: Unchanged
6. Estimated Costs:
 - a. Contract status: None
 - b. Supplies per month: Liqueur and cigars per month in monetary value approx. \$10.00. Official entertainment about twice a month
 - c. Money salary per month: None
 - d. Travel and other expenses per month: None so far. In the near future, however, CAMLET expects to travel abroad in which case it is recommended we give him about \$50.00 in foreign currency for "pocket money".
 - e. Services (travel facilities, housing, etc.): None
 - f. Possible disposal costs if
 - i. Personnel simply dropped: None
 - ii. Security hazards require flight and resettlement: As a leading member of a large political party CAMLET will enjoy powerful support in the American Zone and is not dependent on our facilities. Should the Western Allies be forced to withdraw from Berlin, however, it is recommended that CAMLET be evacuated by us.
 - iii. Personnel is captured or killed while operating for us: None
 - g. Possible organizational obligation inherent in developing this project: CAMLET is contemplating a visit to the United States where he will be the guest of leading newspaper publishers. He will obtain an American visa and necessary documentation and tickets through his overt connections. However, any help we can give him in the U.S. will be most appreciated and will strengthen our control over him. No formal organization obligation is envisaged in this connection.
7. It is recommended that CAMLET, and the large organization under his control, be utilized in the "UMPIRE" Project. For details see BSC/Ops/253.
